



The feature this issue are three very special bottles in my collection. Each is a pre-prohibition pure rye, very difficult to come by with the labels.

The first bottle is a clear glass Harvard Pure Rye by Klein Bros. of Cincinnati, Ohio. It has a cream color labeltrimmed in green, red, gold, and black. Most appropriately, the bust of a scholar appears on the label as do a set of books and a globe which are not visible in the photograph. It's embossed in the back and a seal bearing the signature of Klein Bros. is across the

cork top.

Next is a brown glass Puck Pure Rye. The word Puck is written in silver on the beige label. A partially clad boy wearing top hat, tie, suit jacket and a scarf-type covering below his waist is pictured leaning on a bar and a liquor bottle. Interesting!

A Mumm's Extra Rye is last. It is from N. M. Uri of Louisville, Kentucky. The black and white label is featured on this brown glass bottle, which is also embossed.

Boozeville

There will be those who will find this trip to Boozeville objectionable. But this bottle is a record of those historic times and a part of everyday life which went on around 1900. The hum drum of very hard work and not too much outside entertainment, such as we have today, made small jokes of this type a necessity in those days.

This bottle was found in a Portland flea market by Shorty Johnston, a long time giveaway collector. He very generously let it be photographed so that everyone interested could enjoy seeing it. The Germans were great at ceramics and did many naughty types such as this. It is 4 1/2 inches tall and is not marked. It is plainly a small boy sitting on a pot passing a gold coin. The coin is a bright, shiny gold color while the boy wears a red cap and a white gown.

We have to guess at the words of the bartender as he handed it to a customer. Maybe something like this: "Here is a drink on the house, Joe. Your money isn't worth a ---- around here." Or possibly he said: "Here is your pot of gold at the end of the rainbow." Oh, well, maybe you can think of a better

This is a first class saloon we are in here in Boozeville....ceramic tile floor, brass footrest rail and everything.

"Say there, Bartender! Two more over here but this time we would like them in a glass please." --L.M.--



Old, Odd, or Unusual by James A. Triffon

For this month I have four pieces that will fit three categories in the title - new, odd, and very definitely, unusual. These pieces were obtained in Singapore last fall, by diligent searching in the Chinese quarter. There are literally hundreds of small stores, open air and enclosed, to look through. A good, comfortable pair of shoes is a necessity, not a luxury. However, this is part of collecting that is most enjoyable - "The Hunt." As you can see from the pictures, these are extraordinary in any language. I may not have the vocabulary of words to properly describe these, but I shall try.

I will start with what I call the DRAGON BOAT for lack of a better name. The bottle is Martell V. S. O. P. MEDALLION COGNAC from France, of 30 ml capacity and green in color. The boat has some imposing dimensions - 10 1/4" long, 2 1/2" wide, and 6" in height. Except for the bottle, the piece is molded plastic. The base is dark brown in color with the words MARTELL COGNAC embossed on it. The boat and man are completely covered in gold colored foil or leaf, bringing out all of the detail of the large dragon head and tail, and simulated carvings on the hull. The bottle is 4" tall, so you can get an idea of the size of the head. There must be a story behind all of these pieces; however, I do not have any more information.

The next piece is a SAMPAN, 7 3/4" long, 4" in width and 8 1/2" tall. The bottle is exactly the same as in the Dragon Boat. The base is very similar also, dark brown in color, and the words MARTELL COGNAC on the front and a row of Chinese letters on the back. These are raised embossing as in the Dragon. The hull of the Sampan is completely covered in gold colored foil or leaf and again the detail is very sharp and clear. The hull planks, deck of the stern, and the rudder and stern rails are very well detailed. The two sails and masts are an ivory colored plastic, very well done, with four Chi





nese letters embossed on each sail.

The third piece is a HORSE DRAWN CARRIAGE, and as in the others, large of dimension, however, well proportioned. The bottle is the same MAR-TELL as the others. This piece is 9 1/2" long, 2 3/4" wide and 3 3/4" in height. The front of the carriage has the words MARTELL COGNAC SINCE 1715 in raised embossing, as is the back of the "seat" with the same words embossed on it. The piece is completely covered in the same shiny gold foil or leaf on plastic. The detail of the horse, carriage, and wheels is very good with the wheels turning on the metal axle.

The last piece to be described is last only because the bottle is different from the previous three. The bottle is green in color, 3 5/8" tall, 2.5 cls capacity, and is imported from France to Singapore. As you can see, this one is COURVOISIER COGNAC. The dimensions of this piece are as imposing as the others. Rectangular in shape, it is 9 1/4" long, 2 3/8" wide, and 4 3/4" tall on a base that is maroon in color. Embossed on the front and back are the words COURVOISIER - THE BRAN-DY OF NAPOLEAN, the Napolean logo, and Chinese letters or words. The figure on the right is, I believe, a Lion Dog, while on the left... I don't know! These must have some significance in Chinese legend or stories. Both figures are covered in the same shiny gold as the others, and the whole display is covered in a clear plastic (not shown in the photograph).

The four pieces are advertising or creative marketing at its best. They are comparatively large for a miniature collection, quite gaudy in overall appearance, but well worth the trouble in packing and transporting from Singapore. I personally am pleased that I have them in my collection... as a conversation piece, if nothing else.

Meet The Collector: DON PROSISE

Since our last collector was from Germany, thought you'd be very happy to look at someone back here in the old U.S. So, this time we journey to Maryland to meet with Mr. Don Prosise. Let's let Dontell his own collecting story:

"I've been collecting minis for about four or five years now, and after seeing how many different ones there were to collect, I decided to specialize as a good many other collectors have. I mainly collect ryes, bourbons, and straight or blended whiskies. I'm also very fond of the mini beers and have about 170 in my collection...give or take a couple. While I have about forty figurals, they are what you might say are the ones that strike my fancy or are very different. I also collect back bar pieces and related advertising items. However, my first love are the straight minis with their beautiful labels and embossed glass.

"You might say I got into mini collecting through the 'back door.' Originally I collected all of the Stitzell-Weller decanters in full size and when I had that just about completed, I thought about collecting their miniatures. One thing led to another and I got hooked on the minis. I think I have all of the

miniatures they made except for one that keeps eluding me. That one is the W.L. Weller special reserve in a short round bottle with a white label. Some collectors refer to that shape as a mini decanter, while the distillery calls it a drum bottle.

"Now let's turn to my pictures. In picture A from left to right are four pretty good ones: An Old Crow 1926 from Consolidated Distilleries Limited (CDL) in Canada; it has a somewhat longer neck than most bottles. A Seagram's 1927 Pedigree Straight Bourbon with a Maryland tax stamp is next. Then we have an Old Dixie American Bourbon 1928 from United Distilleries Ltd. (UDL): it's a little larger than regular bottles (2 oz.). This one has an old Maryland strip tax stamp and a picture of an older gentleman holding his glass up in a toast. Last in the picture is the Seagram's '83' Brand 1929. This is a very pretty bottle with fluted sides.

"Picture B shows four pre-prohibition bottles. We begin with an Old Taylor with an applied top. The revenue stamp is gone so can't really give a date on this one. It's short and rectangular with a diagonal two piece mold. Next is an Old Fitzgerald embossed



with the words ''Old Fitzgerald Hnad Made Pot Still.' Third is the Duffy's Pure Malt Whiskey 1906 out of Rochester, New York. It has all labels and is still half full. The front of the bottle is embossed with a design (crest) circled by the words The Duffy Pure Malt Whiskey, Rochester, N.Y. The last one is Old Grand-Dad Bottled in Bond. This is an unusual bottle in that the neck and top is shorter and thicker than most. It dates 1911-1917 and is from Old Grand-Dad Distilling Co., Hobbs, Kentucky. It also has the original box it came in.

"Picture C shows six bottles of which four are pre-prohibition. At left is the Fulton Straight Rye Whiskey from Myers & Co., Covington, Kentucky. The label is printed in English on one side and French on the other. Second is the Coon Hollow Bourbon Whiskey from British Columbia Dist. Co. (BCD), A very pretty and colorful label and the bottle is embossed all over. Next is Kellerstracs Rye (pre-pro) from Kansas City, MO. Next is Old Buckly Ben 90 proof from Lionel Distillery in Chicago. It has a 1937 Illinois tax stamp, is very thin and a taller bottle than most. It has a picture of a cowboy riding a bucking bronco on top of the label. It's a very colorful gold label with red and black overprints. Next is a prepro Red Top Rye from Fred Wertheimer & Sons. The bottle is brown glass and embossed. Last, but not least, is an original Mt. Vernon Rye. It's a pre-







pro, embossed brown glass with all labels. It has a kick-up bottom and contains 1 3/5 oz. The company was established in 1826 but this one at a rough guess would be early 1900's.

"Picture D shows five bottles of rye whisky of which I feel two are very unusual. Roxanna Rye (2nd from left) is a very small bottle by normal standards. It measures only 3 1/4" high. It is 100 proof Strictly Straight Maryland Straight Rye Whiskey, prepared by Theodore Netter, Philadelphia, Maybe it's one of those micro-minis that Vic Visalli is always talking about.) The other unusual one is the last bottle in the picture. It's Monongahela Rye and it not only has a Pennsylvania state tax stamp (right on front) but it has a larger strip stamp (paper) on one side that reads - 'Sample - Not to be sold - Possession of this bottle by Licensee Unlawful. ' Dated 1934-1938 on revenue stamp. The other bottles are UDL Old Rye Whisky 'Special'. It is bonded, but has no age or date on it anywhere. It has 2 oz. contents and is stamped on head 'Export.' Next are a Sam Thompson Rye. This is a bonded rye whisky by Schenley at the Sam Thompson Distilling Co. It has a Maryland tax stamp and was bottled by Jos. A. Finch Co., Inc. It's 90 proof and from the late '30's. Finally we have an Old Horsey brand, Straight Rye Whisky 86 proof and bottled by Sherwood Dist. Co., Westminster, Maryland. It is a 5 year old and has a Maryland tax stamp.

"The last picture is yours truly in front of two six foot shelves studying one of my bottles."

Thank you, Don, for sharing all of this with us.

Things seem to be getting bigger and bigger...and better and better. The picture above is from a recent meeting of the Kobe Miniature Bottle Club of Kobe, Japan. You can count seventeen members in attendance plus the man behind the camera. From the looks of the bottles on the wall behind the gentlemen, it's easy to see that magnificent collections may be found in all parts of the world.







This article is a continuation of the series on "different" miniature bottles. However, keep in mind that I am not talking about the bottles particularly, but more about the way it is merchandised or displayed. These three pieces pictured were purchased in Tokyo, Japan. I have mentioned before about the merchandising flair and techniques of Japan being superb, and I believe these pictures prove it again. The bottles are imported French Cognac and Brandy, with the holders or stands of Japanese design and manufacture.


The first is FAVRAUD COGNAC NAPOLEAN in frosted dark green glass and 30 ml capacity. The stand for the "cannon" is of black plastic trimmed in gold; it's about 6"long, 3" wide, and 3 1/4" high. The front of the gun carriage has a small brass name plate permanently mounted, with the name FAVRAUD COGNAC on it. On the rear

of the carriage is a similar plate, but slightly larger in size, with the same logo embossed on it. The wheels turn, but the "gun" does not tilt. The overall workmanship and appearance of this piece is excellent.

The next "cannon" is a COURVOIS-IER NAPOLEAN COGNAC in frosted green glass of 2.5 cl capacity. As in the Favraud cannon, this piece is of black plastic, again with gold trim. The stand is 5 3/4" long, by 3" wide and 4" tall. The front of the carriage has a shield mounted on it with the Napolean logo emblazoned in gold and gold trim. The wheels, which turn, are rimmed in gold with a very delicate filigree design, again in gold. The







breech of the cannon and the wheel hubs are also in gold. Very striking in appearance, and excellence in de-

sign are apparent.

The third "cannon" to be pictured is an OTARD X.O. COGNAC of frosted black glass, and a capacity of 30 ml. As can be seen, the body has a long, slender neck and a short oval shaped body. The bottle is quite different in shape from the standard cognac and brandy bottles we are familiar with. The gun carriage and wheels are plastic, completely covered in a gold metallic looking finish. The front of the carriage has a simulated metal shield with the words OTARD X.O. COGNAC embossed on it. The wheels will turn,

however, the "gun" will not tilt. Dimensions of this piece are a length of 6", width of 3" and a heighth of 3 1/4".

This completes my series of articles on these "cannons" from Japan. I presently have eleven of these in my collection, and am quite fond of them as they are so different from any other type of figural or figurine. I am not sure how they should be classed, as the bottles are the miniatures, but the gun carriage and stands make them quite large. In any case, I believe they would be a welcome addition to any collection.

Dug Picking's FRAN'S RANCH

The newest in the Dug Picking brothel series is Fran's Ranch which is pictured here in two views. There's quite a story connected to this plane on which the girl sits. It seems one night a few years back six men were flying over to Fran's Ranch in their little Beechcraft. Approaching the area, they became so enthused the pilot forgot to put down the wheels. No one was injured and the men simply walked away leaving the plane. The plane is now a landmark for the area and is lighted each night. If you're wondering exactly where to find Fran's Star Ranch, it's five miles north of Beatty, Nevada with an air strip alongside Highway 95, the main route from Reno to Las Vegas.

Unfortunately, Fran's Ranch fell upon hard times a few months ago. It was destroyed by fire. Following now are parts of an article which appeared in the Nevada State Journal last Decem-

ber 10th.

"Fran York sold her autograph for \$100 at a fund-raising dance Saturday night. It was on her brassiere - but that was appropriate because Fran is the madam of the local brothel and the

benefit was for her.

"The brassiere was one of a number of items auctioned at Saturday's 'Fire Dance', organized by the local VFW post and the Women's Auxiliary, to raise funds to rebuild Fran's Star Ranch which was destroyed in a blaze November 20th.

"About 400 people, more than half the population of Beatty, attended the event in the town 114 miles north of Las

"'We have some people I've never seen before, ' said Bill Terry, a Federal Aviation Administration employee and one of the organizers of the dance. 'We raised somewhere around \$5,000 probably a bit over that. One major contributor said the money couldn't have gone to a more worthy cause.'

"'She's always helped everybody else when they needed help, 'said Irene Sorensen, who contributed \$1,000 raised in card games at her Sourdough

Saloon. 'Now it's her turn.'

"Everyone, including ranchers, miners, men from the nearby Nevada nuclear test site - along with local teenagers and children down to age 5 or 6 turned out for the dance to help the popular businesswoman. Terry said it was a typical small town response to a person in need.

"She's been a good friend. She helps people in town. She donates to everything, 'said Sandy Sanborn, a Beatty housewife and friend of Mrs. York. 'This is for her, not the house per se.'


