



Miniature Bottles From Britain

by Ada Felske





Neither rain nor cold will deter a collector in search of interesting miniature bottles, and I am not an exception. The weather in Britain this spring was very wet and cold, unlike past years when I found May and June to be the best months of the year for travel. Here are a few of my "finds".

The Red Squirrel miniature is a very appealing addition to the BENEAGLES line of fine quality ceramic decanters depicting 'endangered species' of Scotland. Manufactured for Peter Thomson (Perth) Ltd. by Beswick at Stoke-on-Trent, the Red Squirrel contains 50 ml of BENEAGLES fine quality Scotch whisky, and measures 3 1/4" high. The Squirrel was introduced to the trade April 1st, 1980, and was eagerly sought after by miniature bottle col-

lectors as well as animal figurine collectors.

The Red Squirrels, native of the British Isles, have been greatly reduced in numbers since the introduction of the larger Grey Squirrel from Canada. Scotland, with its large regions of pine forests, has beomce one of the few remaining strongholds of this attractive woodland animal. While eating breakfast in Grantown-on-Spey (Scotch whisky town), I enjoyed watching this little animal crawl under the lid of a glass-fronted bird feeded and eat his breakfast of seeds - clever trick on a rainy morning.

The BELL'S Bell is truly a miniature bottle for there are three larger sizes on the market in Scotland - the full bottle size, half bottle, and the

quarter bottle that I found there in 1977. All four of the BELL'S porcelain bells were made by Wade, Stoke-on-Trent, who did an especially fine job of gold striping on this mini bottle.

Can you believe SHEEP DIP brand of Scotch whisky? W-e-1-1, they say it is for "drinkin' and not dunkin'," When I saw this bottle among a group of well known brands of Scotch Whisky I had to take a close look at the label to know it belonged in that location. The green glass bottle actually contains 2 oz. of 8 year old Highland malt whisky. The fine print reads: "This whisky is much enjoyed by the Villagers of Oldburyon-Severn". Mr. Dowdeswell, pub owner in Oldbury, explained that the local farmers in this sheep-raising area have, for many years, called whisky "Sheep Dip" and he thought it would be an appropriate name for his bottling venture, Mr. Dowdeswell buys the malt whisky from Stanley P. Morrison Ltd., Glasgow, owners of Sherriff's Bowmore Distillery, Isle of Islay and Glengarioch Distillery at Old Meldrum north of Aberdeen. Obviously Morrison's do not want to say where this particular malt whisky is distilled.

Convinced that "Sheep Dip" was actually Scotch whiskey, it was not as shocking when I saw the last bottle pictured here -- PIG'S NOSE. A clear glass, round bottle containing 1 2/3 oz. of Finest (?) Scotch whisky. Mr. Dowdeswell explained this was a very good blend of 3 year old Scotch whiskies. The fine print reads: "in Gloucestershire 'tis said that our scotch is as soft and as smooth as a pig's nose."

I wonder what brand name will be next - there are many animals in the rural area of Oldbury-on-Severn, Gloucestershire. --A.F.--





Old, Odd, or Unusual by James A. Triffon

The eight bottles pictured and described for this issue are all new and non-imports. These bottles were purchased at the Chicago (Midwest) Mini Fair in April, and were brought to Chicago by Giuliano Pratolini of Italy.

These pieces are very interesting and different in their design and shape. They are identical in size, shape and cpas, being 4 1/2" (11.5 cm) tall, and 2.5 cl capacity, but the contents and proof vary from bottle to bottle. The bottles are clear glass, slender in overall appearance. The bottom and top of the bottles are molded in a rock or stone pattern, with the center section being round and smooth for the label placement. The labels are all of the same design, but each with a different color scheme for each liqueur and one cherry brandy. The company name is Vaccari and the contents are: ALKERMES, ELIXIR DI CHINA, AM-ARETTO, CHERRY BRANDY, FIORI ALPINI, CEDRO, KUMMEL, and MENTA.

This is a nice set, different and unique, to have in any collection.



This issue shows three more of the unusual, unique and different pieces from Japan and Singapore.

To start my descriptions and story, I shall travel back in time to the wild west days of the U.S., namely the famous covered wagon in our history. This piece was created in Japan, believe it or not. The bottle is Haller's County Fair Bourbon Whiskey, in clear glass of 86 proof and 1/10 pint capacity (50 ml) distilled by W.A. Haller Co., Philadelphia, PA for export. The carrier or holder for this bottle is the replica of the covered wagon. A very well done plastic molded piece in a light tan color body and wheels, white "canvas" top and the rim of the wheels a dark brown to give the appearance ofiron. The "canvas" shows the weave of the material and the body shows the grain of the "wood", and the wheels will even turn. This is well proportioned and would be a nice addition to any collection. Size could be a deterent though as it is 6 1/2" long, 4 1/2" tall and 3 1/4" wide, not including the wagon tongue.

The next piece, also from Japan, is from the collection of our editor and publisher. This is Brunel Napoleon Brandy de France. The Brunel bottle is frosted, dark green glass, 45 ml capacity and 80 proof. The printing on the bottle is gold, with an embossed crest with the letter "N" in plastic or metal glued to the top. The holder for the bottle is a very striking piece of work. The statue of Napoleon is done in a pewter-like metal, standing on a base of porcelain. The base has the look of granite in shades of black, gray and white. The statue of Napoleon is 5 1/2"

tall itself, with the overall height being 7", a width of 4 3/4" and a depth of 3". The front of the base also has a metalplate, pewter-like in appearance with the name of the brandy. Another outstanding piece for any collection.

The last piece in this series is another one of those gaudy, but magnificent creations from Singapore. The bottle is Martell V.S.O.P. Cognac in dark green clear glass, of 30 ml capacity, 3 7/8" (9.9 cm) tall. The holder like the other pieces previously described is large...9" long, 5 3/4" tall and 2 1/4" thick. This is a molded plastic, very well detailed of eight people in a small boat. I am sure there is a story of some kind here in Chinese legends or lore, however, I have no information on this.

The piece is finished in the bright gold plating or foil with the base of the bottle holder having six Chinese characters embossed on it while the back of the base, in raised embossing, has the words "Martell Cognac". This is large in size like many others I have pictured and described, but a delight to have and a conversation piece. This last piece is also from the collection of our editor.

In the past few months, I have pictured and tried to describe a dozen or more of these truly unique, different and magnificent mini "holders". I also consider them rare, because they are very hard to pack and transport and I don't believe many collectors will take time and patience to collect them. I personally am very glad I had the opportunity to do so and consider it to be very worthwhile.

Two Old Grand-Dad Whiskies are the subject of this month's article.

For those of you who collect Old Grand-Dads, you may know there are many different varieties. The two that are featured in this article are not common, and I believe the first is a real gem since I have never seen one before.

The first amber bottle is a corker, dated 1904, bottled 1908. Unlike other Old Grand-Dad bottles, the color combination is different. The label is beige and light blue with red writing. Furthermore, I'm sure you've noticed how the photograph of the man in the center of the label has changed through the

years. Each man is characteristic of a span of several years. However, the gentleman pictured in the bottle we are speaking of is unique because I have never seen him before - or again!

The next bottle is more of a standard Old Grand-Dad, made 1911, bottled 1917. It is made of clear glass with a combination glass and cork stopper.

It would be interesting to see what the Old Grand-Dad label looked like in the 1800's.

Oh, and one other thing. The distiller for the first bottle is M. A. Wathen Distillery whereas the other is the Old Grand-Dad Distillery Co., Hobbs, Kentucky.

Boozeville by Lloyd McLeod



Party, party, party. That's all they do here in Boozeville. Please meet three champagne girls from Boozeville. They work mostly at night and sleep all day.

These small ceramic bottles were given out in bars and hotels. Some times the bartender would be promoting a special brand of whiskey. He would put about an ounce in one of these bottles and hand it out to one of his better customers. For some of these old miners and cowboys, this bottle was about as close as they ever got to a girl.

The first bottle has Champagne Girl printed on the glass. It is six inches tall. There are three or four of this style with the colorful fruit at the base of the glass. She wears a white skirt, green blouse, and red shoes.

The flask bottle is sometimes called "Party Girl". It was made in Germany

and has the crown mark on the bottom. It is 3 1/4" tall including the cap. She has a white slip on black stockings, red shoes, and is holding a rose. She sits in a green glass. The rest of the flask is all simulated wood grain.

The third bottle is also German. It has the champagne girl embossed on the side. It is 6 3/4" tall and colored black at the bottom, while silver at the top. She is wearing a white and blue dress, white and blue hat, blue stockings, and gold shoes. The glass she sits on is silver.

The owner of this saloon is having his birthday party tonight and everyone's invited. So after 12 midnight all the drinks will be on the house. All the girls will have the night off and will be at the party. That will be sort of like a busman's holiday for them. Sounds as if it will be a lot of fun looking forward to seeing everyone there, L.M.

Now in the U.S. it is quite difficult to find more than a handful to purchase.

Two of the bottles are rather common in shape while the other three are much more interesting. The Otard Cognac and Baron Otard V.S.O.P. are the more standard type bottles while the Napoleon, Extra, and X.O. are all quite striking (also fantastic tasting!). The Napoleon is in a frosted green glass while the other two are notenorthy for the interesting shapes and caps. However, all must really be seen to be appreciated. Look for these whenever you travel to Europe or the Orient.

The following was sent to me from collector Wilson Harrell of Newport News, Virginia. See what a little ingenuity will do...

"To the Miniature Bottle Collectors wherever you are, here are some ideas on collecting and finding bottles in your area.

1. Run an ad in your local Trading Post Classified Newspaper...,most every metropolitan area has one. It usually costs about \$1 a week.

2. Due to the high cost of living, I only use the local Daily Newspaper every four to six months. This is approximately \$19 or \$20 for ten days.

3. Friends are a great source for bottles, especially if they are going overseas.

 Maintain contact with reputable dealers and you can pick up some new bottles.

My ads usually say (run under the WANT TO BUY section):

Want to buy or trade Whiskey Miniatures. Telephone numbers:....

I have bought several collections from which I could use about 1/3 to 1/2 of the bottles and sell the rest. This has helped me build my collection from a couple of hundred (three years ago) to over 1,500."

Thank you, Mr. Harrell, for sharing some good ideas with us.
