You'll read a good deal more about this problem in months to come. If we work at it, the problem will be stopped!

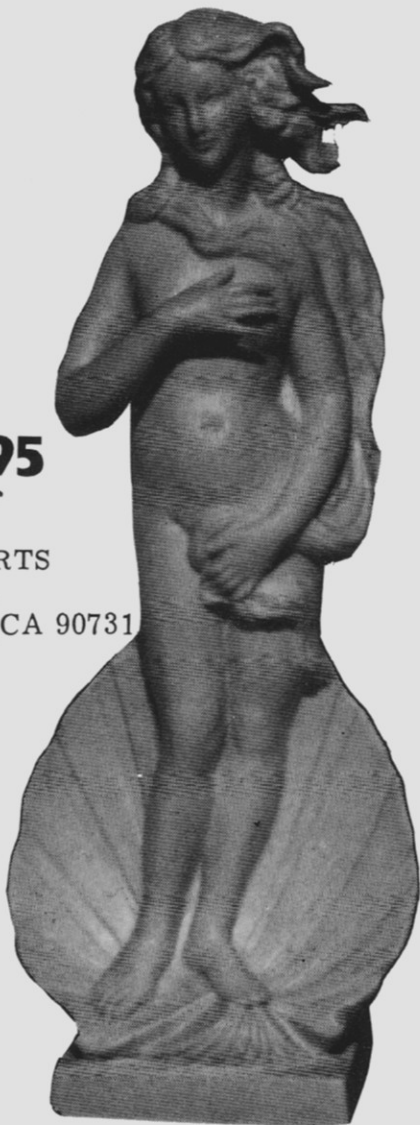
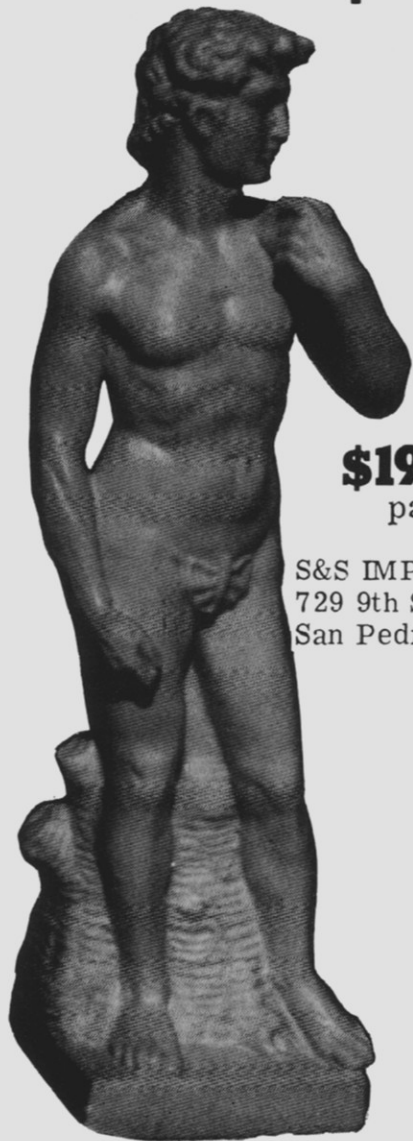

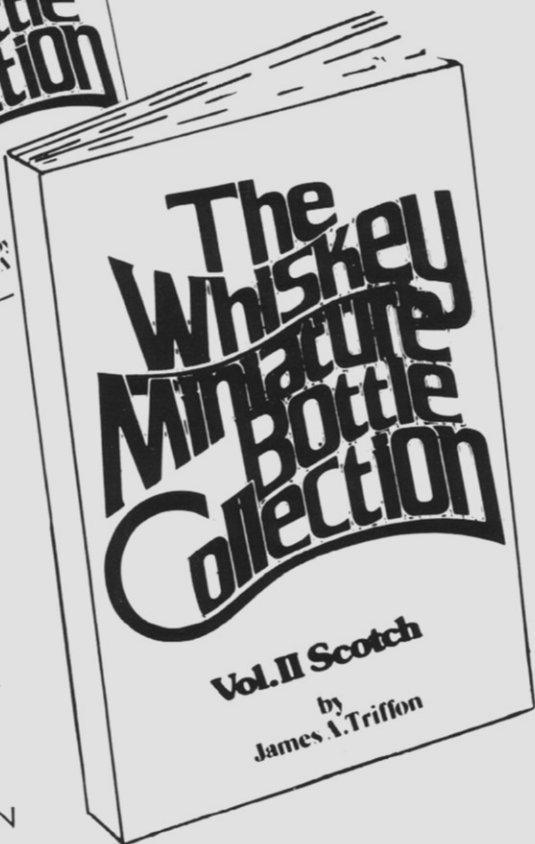

Already in release by the time you receive this issue, the Mona Lisa is number eleven in the Brothel Series. Mona Lisa is located in downtown Elko, Nevada, on I 80 between the two big casinos. If you're wondering about the significance of the piano in this decanter, it seems that the "club" features the oldest piano in the state and that folks come from miles around just to hear that piano!

The other bottle pictured is Carol's Stardust in Ely, Nevada. Ely is the western base for the MX missile hence we have the girl riding the missile. As with all the recent bottles, the color and workmanship is excellent and the

designs become more and more clever.

To bring you more up to date in what has been recently issued, this is the order of the bottles seen in recent months: #7 La Belle, #8 Patcia's Hacienda, #9 Mustang Bridge Ranch, #10 Barbara's My Place Bar, #11 Club Mona Lisa, #12 Janie's Ranch (pictured last time), #13 will undoubtedly be Carol's Stardust.

Finally, if you missed the Mustang Bridge Ranch, you'll no doubt have a very difficult time finding it. They are all sold out everywhere and seem to be available only over the counter at the Ranch... for \$50 each!

COGNAC

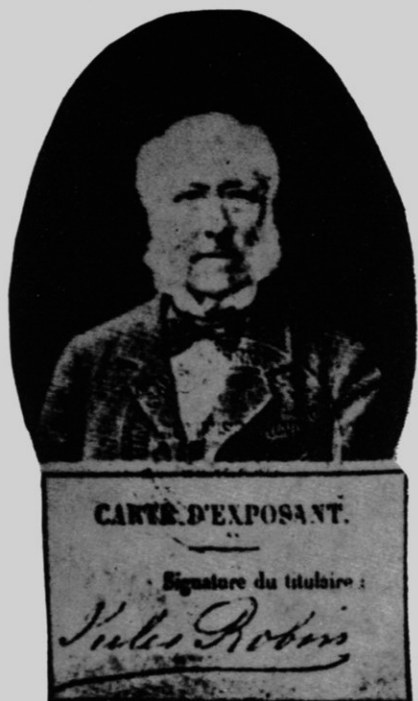
For my second article on cognac, I am going to give you a short history of Jules Robin & Co., and show some bottles they sent me plus a few of my own.

In the 16th century, the decedents of Jules Robin began to make cognac. In those days, the distilling of wines was known only to a very privileged few. One of these few was Jehan Robin, who held the title of "Sire of the Chaple". The family would sit around the pot still during the long winter months, keeping the fires going under the still. The men would sew while the women would talk of different distilling methods and techniques which would make their cognac the finest in the land.

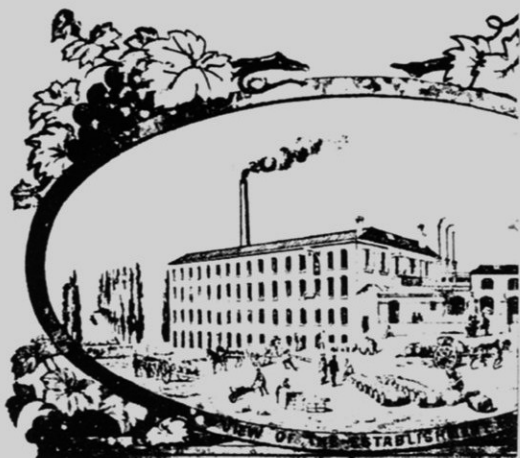
Jules Robin & Co. was founded in 1845, which is when I believe Jules Robin took over the company and put his own name on the cognac that was made. He had a dynamic personality, and frequently took business trips to sell his cognac and promote trade. In those days cognac was bartered for or paid for in gold. In 1878 he visited the Universal Exhibition in Paris to introduce his fine cognac to visitors from other countries as well as to his own countrymen who also made cognac.

Jules Robin was the first to sell his cognac in bottles and for this he received the nickname of "Mr. Six Cases" because not only did he sell his cognac in barrels but also insisted that his clients buy six cases of bottled cognac. Hearing of the bottled sale of cognac, his competitors quickly saw the advantages of this new selling process and began to do the same.

I believe the Jules Robin Co. is still family run, but I'm not certain as this information was not given to me. I would like to thank the company for all their help in preparing this article. And now for the best part, the bottles!

Foss Company has said it is going on a three week schedule, one bottle every three weeks. That will be great if the distillery sends them out. Only time will tell.

Just after I wrote about nothing in the last issue, we were flooded with new bottles. The Banded Mallard, Bobcat, Badger, Ruffed Grouse and Desert Sheep all arrived. Next should be the Mountain Sheep (say I with "tongue in cheek") and I have a picture of the Prairie Falcon that is very nice, although I am getting tired of falcons. I wouldn't be surprised to see the "Sharp Tailed Grouse" made, since a new subdivision is to be built, and it is said to be their favorite place and could face extinction with this subdivision. This is only guessing on my part though.

I have a very nice letter from Italy from Fabio Vicinanza. He is looking

for old Italian minis, especially Buton, Stock and Branca in the size of 50 or 70 cc. Other firms will be appreciated too. The best way of shipping has been tested though the post in parcels of about 50 minis each. It looks as though our American collectors have depleted their stock. He says, if you will send him your want list, it will get his best attention. He stocks about 5,000 different minis from all over the world. Anyone interested can write me for his full address if an SAŞE is enclosed with the letter. There is an invitation to stop and see him in Rome at their next bottle show on Oct. 24th and 25th. I guess this proves that MBC is read around the world.

I will be in Bermuda the first part of May, but found they didn't have much of a selection that wasn't available in the U.S.

Looking forward to summer, even if we did have a very mild winter and it has been lovely lately. 'Til then...

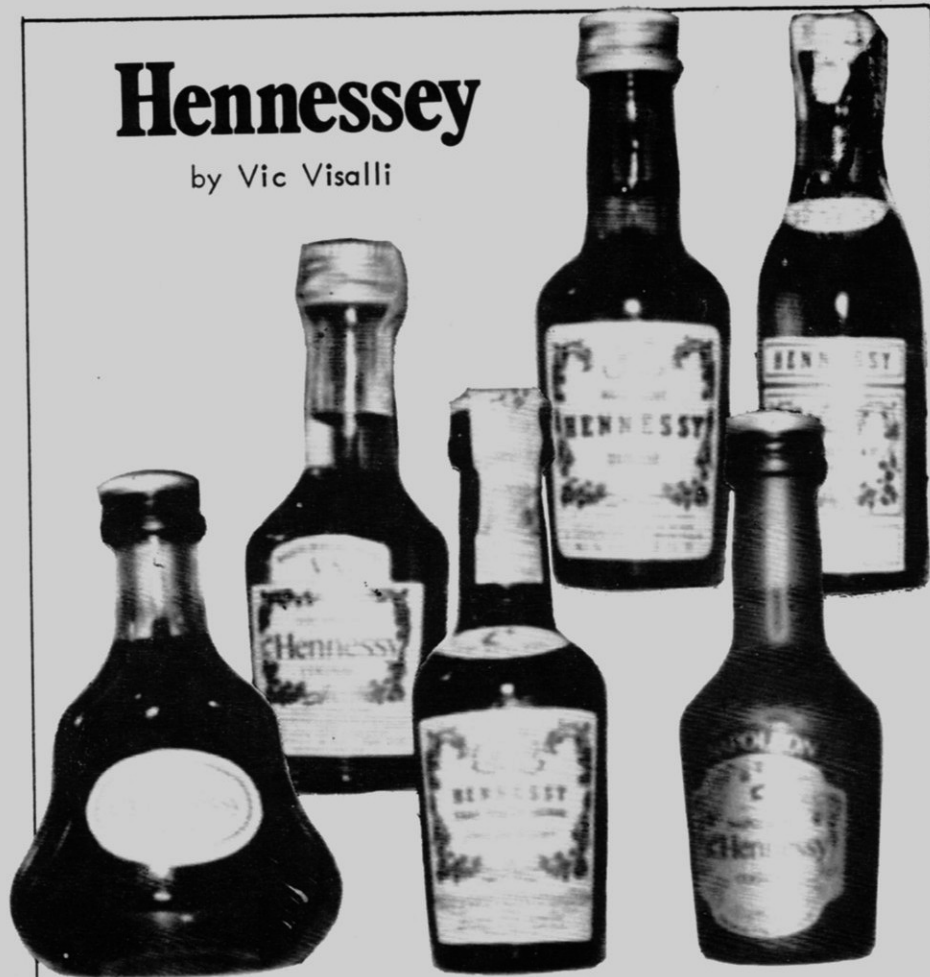

At this time, "Treasures of the Past" will not be featured so that we can talk about and picture six different cognacs. These cognacs are from the Hennessy Company, which as most of you know is one of the most popular names associated with cognac.

Every collector probably has at least one Hennessy in his collection, so I feel fortunate to be able to feature six of the seven Hennessy cognacs known to exist. There is still one which evades me - that is the Cuvee Superieure.

First is a Three Star, followed by a Bras Arm, V S and V S O P, all of which can be obtained in this country in both miniature and large form. They are made of clear glass. The large (fifths) versions of these bottles range

from \$10 to \$25 in price.

The Napoleon and the X O miniatures are not available in this country and therefore are seldom seen. They are, in my opinion, the finest of the six miniatures. The Napoleon is made of green frosted glass with a gold label, the larger version of which sells for \$50. Finally, the X O, my favorite, comes in a decanter type bottle; the larger version of this one sells for at least \$100.00(!), not exactly something you would drink "on the rocks".

Before closing - just to explain what V S O P and X O stand for - "Very Superior Old Pale" and "eXtra Old" respectively.

Next time we'll open the treasure chest again.

It has been some time since the bottles from the Italian Company of Sassano & Pagani have been shown in these pages; however, it appears from the pictures supplied us that the firm has produced some most interesting new glass miniatures and one ceramic.

All the bottles were made to acknowledge the work done by the police or Carabinieri. The ceramic actually presents one of the carabinieri while the glass bottles show the varying emblems of the different police groups within Italy. The smaller set of ten bottles all have the same Amaro contents but the labels are very colorful and interesting. The slightly larger set of three (contents 75 cc) have differing contents but the same excellently done labels. 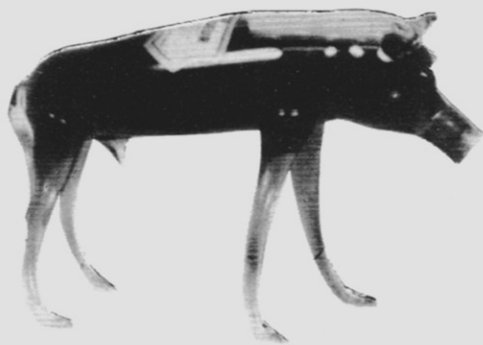
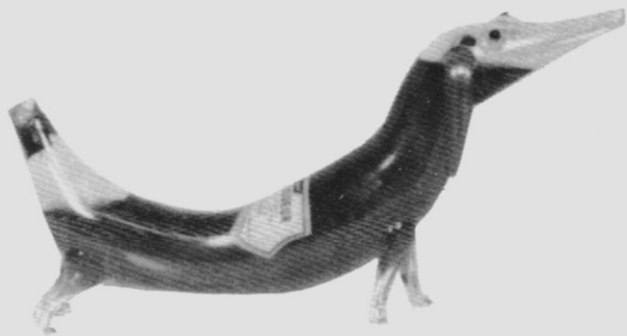

Those of you who attended the October 1980 show in Skippack might recall seeing the next five blown glass animals though one is missing in this issue. The missing one is HEAR NO

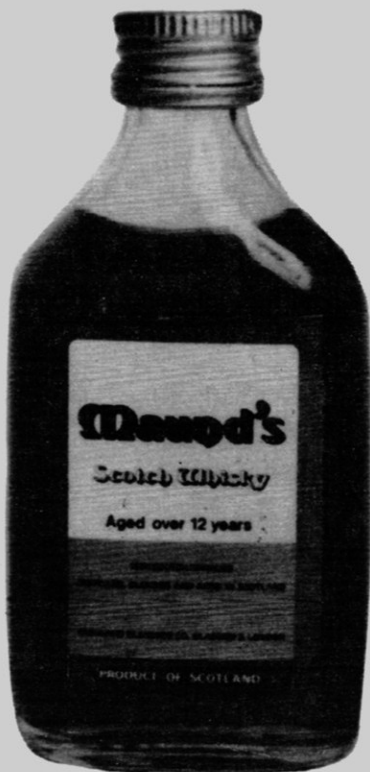
