

A couple of days ago I received the following in the mail: "United, like other domestic and international carriers, is beginning to convert from glass to plastic liquor bottles for inflight use. Plastic bottles will appear to be smaller than glass bottles but do hold the same amount of liquid. The lighter weight plastic bottles will provide easier handling and translate into a fuel savings for the airlines as they weigh approximately half as much as similar glass bottles."



## **MORE SLEEPERS**

Here is another group of "sleepers". Of the three Country Club beers, the one on the left, with the trade mark circle on the large main label, is the most common. The white label is relatively scarce while the reddish-orange label with the trade mark on the neck label is the "sleeper". In case you already haven't caught it, the first two photos of Country Club beers, on pages 40 and 41 of my book were reversed. Sorry about that!!

The four inch John Wieland's mini from California is next to impossible to find. If you've got one you've got a sleeper. A real find!

Next let's consider the tall Wagner and Spearman and the stubby Old Milwaukee: which is the sleeper? So, all right, it's a trick question...all three are sleepers.

Of the three Fehr's beers from Kentucky, all are fairly scarce, but the Darby Ale would have to be considered the sleeper in the group. I've heard rumors that a "Mello" Ale also exists in miniature, but I've yet to see one. If it does exist, it's really a sleeper.














# Ski Country

# Scotch For The Connoisseur

Well, once more the year ends, but where these seven bottles finish 1984, there will be more throughout 1985 for you Scotch collectors to enjoy. I know you appreciate rare bottles for I am sure many of you keep records and some featured will be additions to your lists. Let's get going now with the first of our seven bottles for this issue.

I have featured brewery bottles many times before...so any collector who has Glenafton in his collection has a real beauty from a brewery. The bottle was put out some forty years ago by Bentleys of Leeds in Yorkshire. Melbourne, another hard to find Scotch miniature, also originated in Leeds by the same name as the miniature Melbourne Brewery. That was also in the 1940's.

Bottle number two also comes from Yorkshire and was done for Wilsons of Hull also in the 1940's. It is Lion Blend and is an eight year old blended Scotch...a really desirable miniature for any collection. For bottle number three, we now go to the home of whisky. This is Clanvana Scotch Liqueur which was prepared by Macdonald of Clarvarald off the Argyllshire coast. According to the back lavel on the bottle, it's from the early 20th century.

It was later put on the market by the company of the bottle heading from their offices in central Glasgow in the late '40's. The Scotch Liqueur is 60 proof.

Charles Mackinlay & Co. have produced Scotch for many years and our hobby is very indebted to them. Their M. L. Liqueur Scotch from the '40's is a real beauty and is rarely seen today.


The Distillers Agency still plays a very important part in the whisky industry today, but miniatures do not. Hence, our fifth bottle (as in #5) is very much sought after by collectors.

Bottles six and seven are from the area most people have heard of, Loch Ness. Alex MacDonald & Co. of Inverness put out several bottles and variations many years ago and these two brands are indeed something speccial. Dunosdale Cream and Fine Old Highland are two connoisseur Scotches from a period long since gone.

I hope you have enjoyed these seven bottles from the past. Any collector boasting of all of them certainly fits our heading with his collecting. Hope to be back in '85 with more rare bottles for you to enjoy. --R. H. --

# THE ALSATIAN STORK

The title "Kirsch Cigo" does not give any indication of the producer, because Cigo is short for "Cigogne" which is French for stork. At the bottom, on one side is printed "La Cigogne de Strasbourg", the capital of Alsace. On the other side, "Luxeuil-les-Bains" which is a town in southern Alsace where the bottle is produced. The label shows a stork standing on a chimney and I can't really figure out what it is doing. It looks like it is sipping wine from a vintner's "bombe", an oversize wine bottle.

The neck label shows a stork doing what looks like a goose step (no wonder, after drinking all that wine, or was it Kirsch?) and both labels are done in light red which makes it very attractive.

The red pressed cap is embossed with the number "45" which means it is 90 proof. The bottle is clear glass and 5 centiliters capacity.

# melo's minis

In this article, I would like to feature a "mixed bag" of pre-war miniatures. First we have three pre-pro's, followed by six variations of Wilson and finally two Wisconsin "house" bottles.

As I stated in previous articles, prepro bottles with paper labels are very desirable to most collectors. When one takes into account that these bottles are all over 65 years old, it becomes easy to understand why so few are available. I am always ready to "retire" one of these into my collection.

The first of the bottles is Winchester Club Private Stock Whiskey, A Blend by Sol, Block & Griff, Kansas City, USA. It has a tan label with brown printing and I would guess this was a private brand which dates from about 1910.

Bottle number two is Kellerstrass Rye by Kellerstrass Distilling Co., Kansas City, MO, USA. It is twelve years old, has a white label with blue printing, ribbed embossing and was made about 1900. This bottle was made in a fifteen year old version (Snyder name embossed on the back of the bottle. This brand is fairly common without labels.

The third of the pre-pro's is Steinwender Yellow Label Bottling of Old Crow Bourbon, bottled and guaranteed by The Steinwender Co., St. Louis, MO. It has a yellow label with black printing and was made about 1910.

The Wilson Distilling Co. has produced many fine blended whiskey miniatures over the years. The six I have chosen to show are all from the 1930's. The first of these is "That's All" and is embossed with a man holding the world on his back. It has a yellow label printed in orange and black, is 90

proof, one year and six months old and was distilled in Relay, Maryland. Bottle number five is "That's All" in an old label and has the same embossing. It is a white label printed in gray and black, is 90 proof, two years or more old and was distilled in Relay, MD.

Bottle numbers x is "That's All". It is 90 proof, has the familiar "gray" label, is two years or more old, and was distilled in Bristol, Pennsylvania.

The next one is Wilson Reserve in a curved, flat bottle. It has a black label printed in red, gold and white, is 90 proof, four or more years old and was distilled in Bristol. also.

The last two Wilsons are "That's All" flats. They have the same "gray" labels and the only differences are the color of the shrink wrap over the cap (one is white, one is gray) and the percentages of straight whiskey and neutral spirits in the blend. Both are 90 proof and five years old.

Finally we come to our 1930's 'House Bottles' from the Barbola Liquor Co. of Berlin, Wisconsin. They are Old Faithful Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey, 90 proof, four years old, distilled by Bernheim Distilling Co. of Louisville, KY, bottled by Midwest Distilling Co. of Milwaukee, WI. The first of the two is a clear glass flat while the other is a clear glass, round corker.

I really hate to keep making the same point, but bottles like numbers eight and nine must drive "listers" to drink. Me, I do not need an excuse!

I'll bet the person who drank this bottle would be quite surprised to learn the current sales price is \$130 to \$150 empty!!!


# Wild Turkey

To bring you up to date picture wise on the other two bottles which came out in February and June, here are the Turkey and Raccoon and Turkey and Eagle.

The Turkey and Eagle was made in a very, very limited number. Consequently it is almost impossible to find now. The production run was increased slightly for the Turkey and Raccoon, but it too is on the bottle "endangered species" list.

There are now twelve Wild Turkey miniatures available. Each bottle has been better than the last and the entire series is really striking. On another note, if you happen to save the larger bottles, for this Christmas season the 750 ml Turkey with Poults is available along with a new Wedgwood Crystal decanter which is truly spectacular!!






