

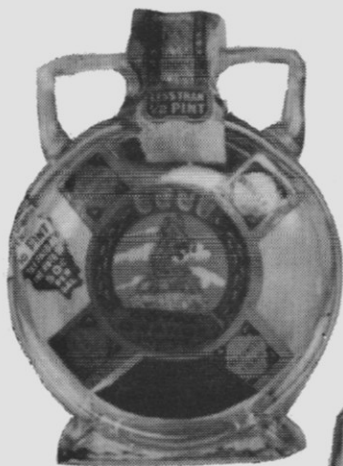

This entire issue is dedicated to the Zwack bottles which first came to collectors' attention here in the United States directly after the end of Prohibition. (For those who aren't certain of the date, our national exhibition of lunacy came to end when the first saloons and liquor stores reopened their doors on December 5, 1933!)

The monumental amount of work and effort which went into bringing you this issue is all due to just one man, Mr. Edwin A. Neugass, III. . . to put it formally. For many years now, Ed has been collecting, cataloging, trading, buying, photographing, living and breathing Zwack bottles. If he heard you had a bottle he didn't, the trading material got better and better the longer you could hold out. Tradition of Excellence

Symbol of Quality

Zwack bottles have been called the "cadillac" of miniature liquor bottles by several senior collectors of miniature liquor bottles whose opinion I respect. These opinions, I believe, come from a general knowledge of the craftsmanship required to make outstanding labels and what skills it takes to make glass in multiple-part molds. The use of complex multiple-part molds was a practice distinguishing the Zwack company from many others. Zwack bottles are stunningly attractive because of the extraordinary glass shapes from these molds. Also, Zwack labels are colorful as well as being elaborate in design.

As a collector of more than Zwack liquor bottles, I recognize that from time to time, individual bottles are produced which are stunning because the shape of the bottle is exceptional and the label(s) is elaborate or very colorful. The purpose of this writing is not to prove somehow that Zwack produced the greatest line of miniature liquor bottles, but rather to give some background information on just how good Zwack bottles are, and to provide a list of known bottles so collectors will have knowledge of what bottles are out there ready to be collected. Also, the issue of how to collect variations is particularly vexing. Perhaps this survey will inspire input from others which will advance/correct what has been done here. Perhaps the material here will prompt others to research other companies which have had a long and inspired history.

The Zwack Company produced a wide variety of bottle shapes. We can record 24 which were made in miniature sizes. The labels were very colorful and elaborate, but Zwack is not the only instance of outstanding liquor miniatures.

Makers of pre-Castro Cuban bottles have provided examples of very colorful and imaginative labels. However, the Cuban glass bottles did not use multiple-part molds so their bottles are, at best, extraordinarily colorful rather than being distinguished by great glass work.

Zwack has not been the only company which produced something superior without making use of modern technology (i.e. automatic glass making machines). The Baccarat Co. is a French company which has long provided some of the finest glass. Remy Martin, in order to promote its Louis XIII Cognac, persuaded the Baccarat Company to reproduce an extraordinary piece of glass whose origins are still somewhat obscure. The glass bottle was produced in two sizes, a fifth and a miniature. They sell for an extravagant price in the U.S. liquor market. By comparison, Zwack produced its own bottles from its factory. The Zwack glass is neither crystal or of the highest purity. However, the bottles were not intended to be presentation pieces, they were for wide distribution. Zwack was for a time a major distributor and maker in many parts of Europe.

It may be surmised that by the 1930's Zwack produced its largest array of

bottles, in many sizes, including miniatures. While various other companies were becoming well known in the U.S. and western Europe, the Zwack company served as a preeminent liquor company for central and eastern Europe.

With the end of prohibition, a surge of these bottles were being shipped to the American market. This accounts for the number of Zwack bottles in the U.S. which also survived World War II.

The Zwack bottles are consistent in style to the romantic 19th century and this tradition carried on to the 20th. The company provided many liquors peculiar to eastern Europe and whose fruits, berries, and grains are simply unknown to those in the west (at least by the names which were used for them). At one point, a total of 220 different liquors were offered by the Zwack Company in many shapes and sizes.

The Zwack Company was court purveyor of fine liquors to the Hapsburgs of Austria. These arrangements were made by the courts of Europe to stabilize quality, price and to convey certain status to those who served the courts. In those days, the honor of serving one's king or queen, even in the most menial way, was a coveted privilege and was highly structured. The upper classes, thus, were retained by their sovereigns, formed the European court system or they were purveyors to one or more courts. Being a purveyor to a court aided the seller in distributing to the general public.

The Zwack Company provided liquor to countries like Austria and Hungary when they were what was called the Austrian-Hungarian Empire. These were cultural centers as well as military. The romantic style pervaded the music of the time and the arts. Can these influences be seen in the style of labels and curve of the bottles? I would not be surprised if some art historian were able to recognize the romantic influences of those times in Zwack bottles.

The "modern" era provided automation. Bottles, of all sizes, could be mass-produced in extraordinary numbers. Machine-made bottles were cheaper to make and more uniform, but they are plain in comparison to the workmanship of Zwack bottles.

The "modern" era has produced fan-

cy bottles, too. Collectors refer to these as figural bottles. Zwack produced some of these bottles as well, but most of these were large size and were lost in World War II when the company was taken over by the communist regime.

In the 1930's the Zwack Company expanded its operations to the United States and the number of bottles which were brought in the country was an explosion of variety. Americans, having experienced prohibition, bought liquor to quench a thirst which had been suppressed for over ten years.

The Zwack Company exists today in Austria. It is the only major European company supplying liquor to have survived World War II's ravages and changes in regimes. Imperial Raspberry, Imperial Apricot, Imperial Pear, and Uicum are offered in both miniature and large sizes.

The question I hear most asks how many different Zwack miniature bottles are out there. My answer is, it depends. That is, it depends how closely you collect variations. What I've done in the balance of this writing is to try to answer this question in a systematic and logical manner which respects the differences of opinions. Column 1 refers to shapes only. If you have 24 different Zwack shapes, you have all the shapes which are available to contemporary collectors. If you have 95 different Zwack labels, you are collecting variations which I believe to be major. You should use column 2. If you have 161 different Zwack bottles, you are as avid a collector of Zwack bottles as I, and you should use column 3 as I do. You will note that I have included certain bottles which are not counted, but are listed. I refrain from counting the communist bottles in this list, nor will I ignore their being there either.

At the bottom of this writing, I have included a number of bottle shapes and major variations which have been seen in print, but may not have survived. I have tried to give some indication of what shape came closest in a number of cases. If you have any of these in your collection, be sure to let me know so this list may be updated.

SUMMARY DESCRIPTIONS OF
ZWACK BOTTLES

The following paragraphs should help define Zwack shapes. By the way, I have included some interesting company tidbits in the information which follows:

Shape

- (1) Zwack used a (what is referred to as) "rounds" by contemporary collectors. What made these bottles special is that they were each embossed with the Zwack name and 4 stars were also embossed on the glass which designates 4 star quality.

These bottles came in two sizes, 3 3/4" and about 4 1/4". These bottles were in brown and clear glass. About 1/4 of all Zwack minis use these bottles. These all had "kickups".

Two major label series were used on these bottles. One had a red paper seal which actually was applied as a separate label. The background field was yellow and green while the other had a crest on a light green field. Other labels appeared on these bottles but were not a part of any series. Over 10 different liqueurs were used in these bottles.

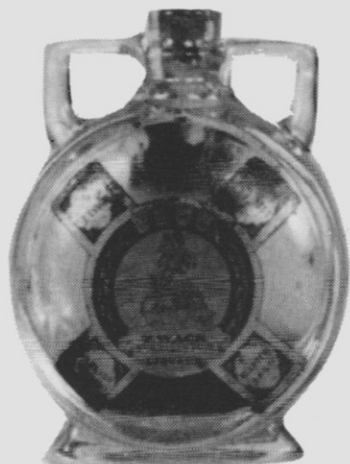
- (2) Zwack used another "round" bottle which was about 4 1/4" tall. It was used exclusively for tokay brandy. It was clear glass only. A few of these bottles of tokay brandy were encased in a straw outer covering.

Other Frequently Seen Shapes

When experienced collectors think of Zwack bottles, there are certain usual shapes which are more plentiful than others. This is because certain ones appear more frequently than others at shows and in old collections. The following fit this category:

- (3) A bottle with two handles which has been called a "watch" shape usually contains Royal Orange Liqueur. It has always been seen in clear glass. The bottle was actually in the shape of a Hungarian cowboy's canteen including the double handle. Leather straps secured the canteen to the





saddle. Sometimes it contained Paprika Liqueur.

- (4) A bottle which is in the shape of a round ball made of green or clear glass comes in two sizes. The neck protrudes from the top of this bottle which contains Unicum Bitters. I have it that during the Hungarian uprising of 1956, the larger sizes were filled with gasoline to serve a nasty "cocktail" for a number of soviet tanks. The taste of Unicum is aromatic, flavorful and like many bitters, requires an "acquired" taste; you'll have to get used to it to like it.



- (5) A rectangular shaped bottle with a "Z" paper label set into a "Z" embossed into the glass. This bottle usually contained Csazar, an apricot of superb quality and flavor. The name Csazar means Emperor and probably has its origins in the Latin title of Caesar.

The King of Hungary in fine regalia is pictured climbing steps with a glass in his outstretched hand. This bottle is informally called the "brick" bottle by the Zwack company and was used for Paprika as well.

- (6) A rectangular shaped bottle closely resembling the "brick" bottle but without the "Z" embossing. The shape has a slight curve into its rectangular shape. It usually contains Tulip Liqueur, Blackberry Brandy, or Paprika.



- (7) A curved neck bottle, paper label on the body most often found containing Peach Liquor. The curved neck originally occurred because a workman made a mistake in the cooling process which must be followed in handling molten glass. The glass here has always been seen as clear. There are some very attractive variations including the Csazar Korte, Menthe Glacial and another Peach Liqueur variation.

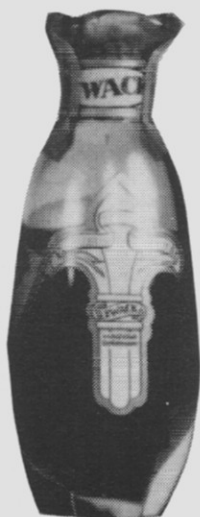
- (8) A tall bottle with a very long neck; the neck is sometimes as long as 4". The label was on a short base of about an inch. This bottle contained Barack Palinka, an apricot brandy liquor. The company called this bottle the "whistle neck" bottle and it has never been seen in

anything but clear glass. As an Eau de Vie, this liqueur is fiery in its taste.

- (9) A bottle referred to as the Tulip bottle by contemporary collectors. This bottle is made of thick clear glass and has a fluted top. The liquor inside was frequently Yvette. It had the label in the shape of a fleur-de-lys. One interesting variation is the Yvette Bourbon liquor. There were also two variations of Framboisette which are very interesting.



- (10) An eight sided bottle made of clear glass with a tall thin neck. This bottle almost always contained Anisette. Anisette, probably, came in two colors. One variation is called Anisette Double, although it is not clear what the difference is between regular Anisette and its double. A slivovitz label variation is extraordinary.



- (11) A short rectangular bottle in clear or brown glass; using clear glass it contained Goldwasser. The bottle using brown glass contained Triple Sec. Four stars appear on this bottle as many other Zwack bottles to (again) signify four star quality. Certain cognac distributed by Zwack was one star, two star, three star, as well as four star.





- (12) A short "round" bottle with short neck and handle. This bottle has only appeared in clear glass. The bottle usually contained Allash Kummel and the paper label pictured a bear on it. A strawberry variation of this bottle is very attractive.
- (13) A short squat bottle in clear glass; this bottle was heavily embossed on the back and has a soldier with his drawn sword on horseback. Contemporary collectors refer to this shape as an oval. This bottle usually contained Apricot Liqueur and an interesting variation of Apricot Brandy Dry.
- (14) A ceramic jug with single handle in white color. This bottle usually contains Allash Kummel with the same paper label as above with the bear on it. Interesting variations were Orange Curacao Sec and Altwater. Some of these jugs still have their contents.
- (15) A short squat bottle in brown glass with vertical ribbing. This bottle usually contained Pineapple Liqueur. The paper label appears on a flat surface in the middle of this ribbing. The label is gold on a black background and is prone to fading. Good samples of these are hard to come by. Nut Brandy was also found in a variation of this bottle.
- (16) A round squat bottle with medium-length round neck has a rounded shape and yet curves into its neck. Also it has a small base on its bottom and usually contains Menthe Glacial. This liqueur came in two colors: green and yellow. Since the liquor in these bottles is old, various shades of liquid have been seen in these bottles. An interesting variation is Creme de Menthe, not Menthe Glacial.
- (17) A medium sized, clear glass shape along the lines of a flask. However, this bottle which usually contains Blackberry Liqueur has a front arc in which an oval label is inset. The sides are flat with an arc and the back is heavily embossed with the heavy crest and the Zwack name on it. Another use of this bottle was Girotte (Raspberry).

(18) A 5" bottle of clear glass with single glass handle. The glass has medium embossing all over a cylinder shape which curves to a 1 1/2" neck which itself curves. It contains Strawberry Liqueur and the gold printing on black background is often faded. The main label pictures a crest containing a knight on horseback with a drawn sword. This crested label on other shapes indicates that Zwack probably had a series using this as a theme.



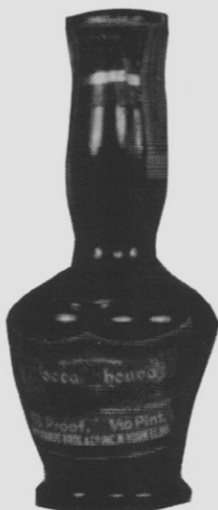
(19) A 3" bottle usually brown glass containing Mandarinette. The bottle has been referred to as heart shaped, thus, the heart sits upside down and the neck protrudes from the bottom of the heart. The bottom of the bottle is pushed up to give the heart-shape to the bottle. The label contains an elaborate crest. An interesting variation of this is a heart shape in clear glass.



(20) A 4" bottle in brown glass containing Cocoa Chouva. This bottle sometimes has straw woven around its neck; the neck itself is in the shape of what is referred to as a "lady's leg". The body is round and sits on a small base. Labels were either yellow or brown.

Rare Shapes in the Possession of Collectors

(21) A medium sized clear glass whose front is rectangular and straight. It contains normal straight sides. The back makes this bottle unusual having three partial flat surfaces and curves where the Zwack name is embossed. This bottle usually contains Nectar of Tokay. Dry Gin also is a variation of this bottle.



(22) A tall cylindrical shaped bottle of clear glass. This bottle is 5" tall and has only been seen containing Cherry Cornell. The label on this bottle is very colorful and covers a substantial part of the body of the bottle.





- (23) A clear glass modern bottle of rectangular shape. It has three different label variations: Barack Palinka, Viense Pear, and Viense Apricot. The glass work of this bottle is undistinguished. The cap is a screw safety cap. This bottle was in distribution for a very short time and was limited in number.

Current Shapes

- (24) A clear glass modern bottle of a "flat" shape. It has four different variations: Imperial Raspberry, Imperial Apricot, Imperial Pear, and Coffee. This bottle is currently in distribution.

Other Shapes

The complete list of Zwack bottles brought into the United States has yet to be uncovered. Zwack provided 220 liquors, some imported from France and Scotland. Certain bottles were clearly considered by the Zwack company as miniatures. Others were 3/100 liter and were probably about 1 1/2 oz. Many miniatures which were brought into the United States are significantly different from the pictures of the same liquor in an old Zwack catalog which survived.
