

After looking through a good many "old friends", I saw the bottles pictured here. Grabbing them all, I headed for the cash register. There a smiling face told me, "Sorry, Mister, can't sell ya those."

Several minutes later after much talking and cajoling, I de-

parted with my little treasures. These were all samples which wouldn't be arriving until just before Christmas so they wanted to look at them a couple of weeks. Instead, I have!

The tequilas seem to have taken the prize. The Jose Cuervo is a new glass bottle with a pull off top. This should be in most markets by now. The other four tequilas however probably won't be seen much outside of Arizona as a local importer brought them in.






The four are all plastic and represent only two brands: Viuda De Romero (an old name many will recognize) and Real Hacienda. Each has a Reposado at 6 months old and an Anejo at 2 years old.

Vodka was the other winner in this group. Royalty is in several markets already and even though it's plastic, it's still a nicely done, stylish piece. The Stolichnaya Orange is a standard glass bottle but sports a well done label. This one will be appearing everywhere soon.

In #125, we discussed and pictured some very rare, beautiful rums featuring natives on the brightly colored labels. We've got ten more people for you this time with a bonus of five rums with horses on the label, another favorite of mine.

Our first picture has Ajouba (France), Flor de Habana (Mexico?), 2 Four Paths (Mexico), and Ara (France). These are, like the previous 13, top of the deck, hard to find miniatures. The "Ajouba" with its bright yellow background is a truly gorgeous mini rum. The two "Four Paths" are also seen wrapped in straw and the "Ara's" label also contains a

boldly colored parrot as well as a mature woman.

Our next five, Pretinha Victoria (Portugal), Suavito (France?), Marita (France), Monsard (Italy), and Primora (Martinique) are also rare and extremely attractive. They depict very classy looking women, an almost 180 degree turn from the previous five.



from his collection and also Ron Danese for getting the photo and sending it to us.


I've been collecting Giveaways since 1957 and would gladly pay \$500 for this one!

MEET THE COLLECTOR:



We travel to Forest Hills, New York, to meet a well known scotch collector. However, we'll let him tell you in his own words.

"Allow me to introduce myself. My name is Derman Villegas. I am 47 years old and Peruvian. I've been collecting miniatures for 22 years now. Like many a collector, I began by accumulating various kinds of bottles. Eventually these totalled nearly 4,000 minis.

Because I live in an apartment, my collector friends suggested I pick a specialty. And so I did. I now collect single malts, scotch whisky ceramics, Jim Beam cars and mini perfumes.

"Ive been corresponding with collectors from all over the world and several have become dear friends.

"My collection consists of 1,500 malts, 550 ceramics, 50 Jim Beam cars and 150 mini perfumes. The cabinet shown in the picture is my newest addition, one of four in all.

"In the near future, I plan to present my collection on a Spanish television program entitled "Sabado Gigante" which airs on Channel 41 Saturday evenings at 7 pm in the U.S. It also airs in 15 other Spanish speaking countries. I hope that such a presentation will motivate aspiring collectors

because I feel that this is one of the best hobbies a person can have.

"Collectors, if you find yourself in New York, please don't hesitate to call me at (718) 275-4068. You can visit my residence to view my collection."

Now, you couldn't ask for a nicer invitation that that!

My newest cabinet filled with Italian fruit minis. The first two rows from the top are Centenari with the black caps. The two bottom rows are the penultimate Centenari with the white caps. You can see from the bottom row the oldest Centenari dated 1960's.

The two center rows belong to new Christian Di Marco that have just come out into the market. Until now, I have 24 and I hope to be getting more in the future. These are the most beautiful bottles I've seen.



FROM JAPAN

This time I would like to present to you two sorts of commemorative miniatures from Suntory Ltd. and then from the land and the sky!

The first is SUNTORY RESERVE which was released to commemorate the new run of the super express train (Yamagata Shinkansen) from Tokyo to Yamagata. This train is called 'TSUBASA' (means WING) and the inaugural run was on July 1, 1992. This miniature was

available only for a short term and only on TSUBASA. Therefore this bottle is not so familiar among collectors. The label is black with a gold line frame and has illustrated TSUBASA in gold.

Kansai International Airport became Japan's first 24-hour airport on September 4, 1994. The airport is in Osaka Bay and "Kansai" is an area including Osaka, Kobe, Wakayama, Kyoto and Nara.



In commemoration of the opening of the Kansai Airport, Suntory Ltd. launched the OLD and ROYAL Whisky bottles with new labels which picture the Kansai Airport. They are 750ml bottles, no miniatures. So the Osaka Miniature Bottle Club the 1/4 scaled down made their and put on labels miniatures which are available in the market. The labels are multicolor based on blue and are very beautiful.

There are now available two new sets of bottles which anyone traveling out of the country should watch for. DFS or Duty Free Shoppers has both these groups of bottles AND some of the ones in each group are exclusive to DFS. You'll find DFS here in the U.S. when you leave the country and then in a good many countries of Europe, Asia and Australia when you are homeward bound.

The Camus set is of five cognacs: V.S.O.P. and Grand V.S.O.P. (in the same bottle) as well as Vieille Reserve and Napoleon Extra Old (again in the same bottle). The highlight of the group though is the new X.O. which is just about as fancy as you can get in a glass bottle. This X.O. will be issued individually shortly.

The other set, Whiskies of the World, is of six bottles but













the six is the regular, well-known Wild Turkey. The other Wild Turkey is a DFS exclusive. It is the 1855 Reserve (sorry about the dark label) and is surely a tough one to get. Those two account for the U.S. whiskies.

Across the Atlantic, we have both the Scotch and Irish bottles to enjoy. As you can see, the Scotch are the Aberlour and Clan Campbell. The Aberlour 12 year old is another DFS exclsusive.

The two Irish are ones I hadn't run across. The Jameson is another label variation but the new Bushmills 1608 12 year old is surely a nice one.

All of these could have come under a huge What's New article; however, the two sets seem like a logical grouping. Hope you've enjoyed them.

I would like to share with you eight more mini square whiskeys from the 1960's and 1970's. All of these minis have tax stamps from Alabama or Tennessee.

Bottle number one is Distiller's Pride Kentucky



Straight Bourbon Whiskey, 86 proof, 10 years old and Bottled by Fairfield Distillery Co., Meadowlawn, Jefferson County, KY. It has a black label with white printing.

The second piece is Wildcatter Kentucky Straight







Bourbon Whiskey, 90 proof, 8 years old, Distilled by The Wildcatter Distilling Corp., Louisville, KY. It sports a green label with white and gold printing.

Bottle number three is Anderson Club Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey. This one is 90 proof, 6 years old, Distilled by The Anderson County Distilling Co., Tyrone, Anderson County, KY. It has a green label with white and gold printing.

The fourth bottle is Canada Dry Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey. This is 86 proof, 6 years old, Distilled by the Canada Dry Distilling Co., Nicholasville, KY. The label is white and gold with black, red, and blue printing.

Next comes Johnny Drum Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey. This bottle is 86 proof, 4 yers old, and Distilled by The Willett Distilling Company Inc., Bardstown, Nelson County, KY. It comes







with a green label with white and gold printing.

The sixth bottle is Daniel Boone Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey. Distilled by Better Brands Distilling Co. of Lawrenceburth, KY, this is an 86 proof and 6 years old. The label is black and white with gold and black printing.


Bottle number seven is Copper Kettle Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey. The Old Spring Distilling Co., Lawrenceburgh, Anderson County, KY, is the distiller and it has an orange label with red, black and gold printing.

The last bottle is Old 1889 Brand Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey. This is 86 proof, 4 years old and distilled by The Old 1889 Distilling Co., Meadowlawn, KY. It has a white and yellow label with red and black printing.

In this article I would like to feature the John Smith Brand by Lionel Distilled Products of Chicago. Also, we'll take a look at the fairly rare Old Valley in a pinch bottle.

Lionel was not a distiller in the traditional sense, but merely bottled distilled spirits. The owners of this company probably all wore fedoras, smoked big cigars and one can only imagine where some of the whiskey came from. Lionel was only in business for a short time in the mid 1930's, during which they produced some of the most gorgeous labels ever created. Iwould invite long time subscribers to look back to M B C #95 for illustrations of this point.

Anyway, bottle number one is Old Valley Straight Whiskey at 90 proof and one month old. It has a green and blue label with a red sun and is from 1934. The hip flask is Captain John Smith Straight Whiskey at 90 proof, with red and black







trim on a white label and is from 1934. The other Straight Whiskey is an embossed square bottle, also with red and black trim but from 1935.

The first Bourbon Whiskey is 90 proof, Three Months old, has red and black trim on a white label and is from 1936. The other flat is Bourbon Whiskey at 90 proof, Three months old, has red and blue trim on a white label and is from 1936. The last of these is a Bourbon Whiskey in an eight

sided ambert bottle from Kent which was a Lionel subsidiary. It is 90 proof, 12 months old, has again red and blue trim and is from 1937.

Finally, I am fortunate enough to have most of the known Lionel brands in my collection. I am missing the Old Buckly Ben wich I would dearly love to have. If anyone can help me on this, plese feel free to contact me.


