I've been told and that wasn't going on the market until August 1st. HOT CINNAMON and MUDSLIDE are funny, clever labels; however, it's OATMEAL COOKIE which is my delight. All of these are quite low in alcoholic content so I plan on having an "oatmeal cookie" after dinner some night quite soon.

Next we have two new labels for two old timers, GENTLEMAN JACK and JIM BEAM. Jack Daniels has changed to white lettering on all sizes of this bottle and Jim Beam of course needed to change as they couldn't keep

using the 200 years old label when it's indeed 201. Jack is glass; Jim is plastic.

A few issues back the glass CAYMANA was shown. Now we have the plastic CAYMANA. Rarely will you see such a change within a year's time, but then also rarely will you see the same product imported from Europe and then from the West Indies. Of course, it looks much more "legit" coming from the West Indies. Well, doesn't it?

This time I would like to present to you some Cognac miniatures which have appeared in Japan.

The first four miniatures are from MEUKOW. They are XO, NAPOLEON, and VSOP. As you see, they are very fancy. They have a carved jaguar on each. The XO is a clear bottle with a golden jaguar while the Napoleon is a dark green with a clear jaguar and the VSOP a clear bottle with a clear jaguar. These were issued in 1995 and then some months later a new Napoleon was launched with a dark green jaguar just like the black one. All bottles are 10.5 cm.



50ml at 40% alcohol.

VILLENEUVE miniatures are also very fancy as you'll note. These cognacs were released only on the Japanese market by Brugerolle & Co. NAPOLEON is a dark blue glass while the BRILLIANT is clear. There are silver and orange letters on the blue labels with golden belt frame, neck labels too. They are 12 cm, 50ml and 40% alcohol.

The next miniatures are two HENNESSY, VSOP and PRIVE. The VSOP has a new label with Hennessy in a dark color framed on the label. Privé was launched













during the private consumption time at home. The miniature was only available as a sales promotion. For example, we could only get it by buying a large bottle and then only for a two day period at only five supermarkets in Osaka!

The last bottle is COURVOISIER VSOP ROUGE which has a seethrough label with a red rose. This was introduced this year only in the Japanese market. This fancy slim clear glass miniature is 11.5 cm, 30ml at 40% alcohol.

DELAMAIN



Located in the city of Jarnac, just a few miles from Cognac, the firm of Delamain continues to produce some of the finest cognacs available. The miniatures you see here are the complete range which Delamain markets. For well over two hundred years, these cognacs have made Delamain a name well known to connoisseurs throughout the world.

After a partnership, Delamain became a family firm in 1920. The mother of the current chairman, Alain Braastad, was a Delamain and the family tradition continues as Alain's son has recently finished his university studies and is with the firm.

Returning to the cognacs, the Pale & Dry is 25 years old, the Vesper 35 years, while the Tres Venerable is 50 years and the Reserve of the Family is 55 years old. There may be a new label for the Family Reserve and if there is you'll see it here in the magazine.

So in your lexicon of cognacs, put Delamain up there above the rest. It's where it deserves to be!

CREMAS d'ESPANA



Sometimes you get that feeling that something good is going to happen. For the first time I was visitng Spain and it was a whirlwind three days in Barcelona. After seeing many of the landmarks (and it is a wonderful city to visit), I wanted to find some liquor stores.

After visiting five or six and being totally underwhelmed, I had given up finding anything except some truly average liqueurs and less than desirable glass figurals known around the world for the

last twenty years.

On the way to dinner, I spied a store while the car was stopped at a red light. After yelling to pick me up after you've gone around the block, I darted out of the car and into the shop. Knowing I had only a couple of minutes, I scanned the shelves and this was when that good feeling came. There in front of me was one set of five different cream liqueurs. Grabbing them and hardly even seeing what they were, I was back on the curb to await the car. Later that night I





drooled over my treasures. Shown here are those creams which have now been added to my shelves.

You'll notice that the bottles say Castle and Montserrat. However, the fine print on the Castle bottles also lists Montserrat and all the bottles are 4cl and 34 proof. It doesn't matter though as these five are great ones to add to a list of cream liqueurs.

The three Castle bottles are Crema de Maduixa, d'Avellana, and Pinya Tropical. If words such as Maduixa are totally unfamiliar to you it's because these names are language written and spoken in northern Spain and part of southern France. Maduixa is a strawberry, avellana is a hazelnut and the pinya is a pineapple.

I confess total ignorance with the Crema d'Aromes del Montserat. Just what those aromas are maybe we'll never know. However, the Crema Catalana is a dessert very similar to Creme Brulee. I know some of you cream collectors wish there had been duplicates in that store and I do too. If there had been, this is surely one that I'd love to sample.



Pictured in this article are two very interesting bottles that are not seen too often. Both are flasks dating back to the 1930's. The Morgan Pacer Blended Whiskey sports a turquoise label with a silhouette of the horse, sulky and driver. The Justin Morgan Blended Whiskey has a buff and black label. Both are products of the Green Mountain Distilleries, Burlington, Vermont.

According to Horses of the World, published in 1923, a Massachusetts tavern keeper moved to Vermont "about a hundred years ago". With him he took a "wonderful little stallion which has perpetuated and made famous the name of his master - Justin Morgan."

The breeding of this horse remains one of the unsolved mysteries but it has given the world a new breed, long and favorably known as Morgans.

The type of horse which has descended from Justin Morgan's bears little resemblance to a Barb or Arabian and none at all to the Thoroughbred. Nor are the Morgans typical to any family in their gait. There is no evidence to show the Morgan matched in running races. The Morgan was dark bay in color with black mane and tail. As pictured in the Justin Morgan Blended Whiskey, the Morgan possessed a short back

with a close ribbed round body with a deep wide chest and small, well-shaped feet.

Another interesting fact is that, being of no established breed then registered, the mares used to mate with Justin Morgan's can not be traced with certainty.

These same photos were sent to the G H Farm, members of the Morgan Horse Breeders Association in 1989, and I received a most gracious reply. The Morgan Horse Breeders Association remains very active today. --V.V.--





As you can see in the first picture, these hand painted minis were produced by Manhattan Miniatures for party favors, bridge prizes, back bars,



and collectors. The box is silver.

The five miniatures pictured here are all pinch bottles. The first one says "Don't Drink the Water, while the second shows a girl in a tub and reads "Bath Time Gin". Number three features a nude girl saying "Don't Forget the Bottle." Next we have that rooster once again chasing a chicken and reads "It's Business I'm After". The last


