This is the newest pair of salt & pepper shakers, Ted the Carver, to celebrate our favorite Hamm's character. Naturally though it will be known as the Totem Pole Bear. If you saw this at the February show in Minnesota you know how cute it is. If you're seeing it for the first time, we're giving you two views of the same set. This set is now available, earlier than we thought. Only 800 sets were produced thus making this the smallest quantity of our trio: canoe, teepee and totem pole.

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# WHAT'S NEW



We know you've been asking for it. We know you've been waiting and waiting for it. And, we know you're keen to add some more plastic bottles to your collection. So here it is...the "What's New" article that relies almost completely on PET bottles. Also with but one exception, you can easily find all of these bottles in the U.S.

**Dooley's** Toffee Liqueur begins the group for us. A product of Germany, it's being test marketed in the U.S. and only given away. Since it's only 20ml which is 30ml under our legal limit, it can't be sold here. This one was given to

me in an Ohio wine shop. Needless to say, it's the only one in the group which was given away.

**Fireball** is a Cinnamon flavored Whisky from McGillicuddy's of Canada. This was found on the east coast. Great label of its namesake. **Canasta** is a Cream Sherry from Spain but nowhere on the bottle does it say sherry. Hmm. Canasta means "basket" in English so...wait a minute, I know. It's something to drink while you're playing cards or maybe a special card game.

Now we have **AGWA** Herbal Liqueur. The only liqueur guaranteed to keep you up late.





One shot of Agwa (we're told) gives you the equivalent of the caffeine found in five cups of coffee. The advertising states that this Dutch liqueur has taken Canada by storm and is now going to be a sales leader here. Ever seen it? This one came from So. California.

Next we come to Havana Club Anejo Reserva from Cuba. Seagram's is just waiting with its marketing campaign for when Cuban goods become legal here. And they should as Havana Club is a superior rum. Note that the plastic bottle is actually embossed with the date 1862. This or a variation of it can be picked up





just about anywhere in the world that has a decent selection of miniatures...just not here.

**Revelstoke** is another spiced whisky from Canada. Say, what is it up there, folks. Can't you drink new Chivas Regal. your whisky without putting a flavor in it? It's going to get as prevalent as schnapps in Minnesota!

Finally we have our two versions of the new **Chivas Regal**. The one on the left is plastic while the other is glass. Even though this one is from Japan, it's also available here. It was found in Florida. As with Havana Club, this one is also date embossed (1801).

Next time we don't take PET's.

# SCOTSMEN

PART I by Tony Natelli



Scotsmen, in various stages of dress, have been portrayed on miniature whisky bottles since at least the end of Prohibition (probably before that) to the present. Whether with kilt or tam or full battle regalia, they are some of the best miniatures ever produced and possibly more than one hundred exist.

Our opening two photos show in various sizes depending on the size of the label, essentially the same figure complete with tam and shield. What makes him fascinating is he can be seen on at least four different labels. In order they are **Ballantyne Stewart** (a 1950's

Italian import and a real gem), **Old Argyll**, **Highland Rose**, and **Burn Stewart**.

The **Ballantyne Stewart Co.** became the **Burn, Stewart Co.** over the years. **Ballantyne, Stewart**, The first **Old Argyll** and **Highland Rose** are among the real "goodies" here (1950's and 1960's) while the second **Argyll** and the **Burn Stewart** are very, very recent, perhaps current. Incredibly, there are at least three more rare versions of **Old Argyll**.

The two **Brae Bonnie** are **Lionel** items from the early 1930's. #1 is a Scotch type, the second Scotch and it are very rarely seen.



As with our two Brae Bonnies, the three **Highland Laird** show a full length Scotsman. Bottle number two is much more scarce while numbers one and three may still be found in Italy. An older, slightly different version of numbers one and three has also been reported.

**McDonald's, Fraser McDonald's, and Sandy MacDonald** all picture our fellow indifferent poses. Fraser is the updated version of McDonald's and along with Sandy is reasonable attainable. This is not so with McDonald's, a really good 1950's scotch.

It's been some time since bottles from Australia were featured. A few years ago there was an active club and more Australian bottles were seen because there was a great deal of interest there. Today we are fortunate to have a look at these older ones. Hopefully one of our Australian readers can shed a bit of light on these pieces.

We begin with two variations of **BOND 7**. The first is a fine liqueur whisky from Gilbey's in Melbourne while the other is a fine selected whisky from Milne and Company. The first is undoubtedly older because it contains 1 2/3 fluid ounces and the second is 50ml.

**Gilt Edge Old Whisky** is also a n

older one but it's from Milne and Company and you can note the little windmill logo at the top of the label on it and also the second of the two **Bond 7**'s. It contains 1 2/3 fluid ounces.

The next one is the **Black King CHESSBOARD Whisky**. It's another of the 1/23 fl. oz. and comes from Van Cooth & Co. of Victoria. **Berkeley Old Blended Whisky** completes our group this time. Again a 1 2/3 fluid ozs. But this time from The Distillers Corporation of Melbourne. It is a blend of malt and grain whiskies which have been aged for five years.

Now who out there can give us some dates for these bottles?





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# VODKA

Continuing on. Last time I ended by mentioning my trip into San Francisco and finding the new bottles. So, here they are...the new Belvedere and Chopin, both from the state owned Polmos of Poland.

I was delighted with the Chopin but since I already had the Belvedere, I only got one to have as a trader. Now you know the rest of

the story. Upon returning home, I looked at the Belvedere in my collection and realized something was different. Upon comparison, you can see that there are a great many differences. Incidentally, if you're wondering, the U.S. version is the one with the hanging tag. This is one time where I think they've improved upon the original.

I realize many of you are savvy enough to know that some companies put the same product in different bottles, but that surely isn't the case with these two. The



Belvedere is made from rye while the Chopin is made from potatoes.

I know that the Dvorak and Tchaikovski have been shown previously, but I thought you might enjoy seeing the three collector bottles together. The first is from the Czech Republic while the second is from Russia.

My other little delight this time is the special bottling of Absolut for St. Valentine's Day this year. This was sent to me by fellow collector Nicos Zevlaris of Cyprus. I'd say it's a great variation. Now we've had the "specials", we'll end with the ordinary. The last bottle is the Citrus flavored Luksusowa from Poland and another potato vodka.



# FROM JAPAN

This time I would like to present to you some changes in miniatures of the **SUNTORY YAMAZAKI PURE MALT** Whisky. Sentry Co. launched the Yamazaki Pure Malt in March of 1984.

At that time, the first miniature was made only as a sample (A). In June of 1985 it appeared on the market in a slightly different bottle shape (B).

In November 1986, a new bottle was issued with '12yo' on the label

(C). It doesn't mean to be on the up grade of contents, only to clear the age of maturity.

As the classification system of Japanese Liquor Tax was repealed in April 1989, Sentry Co. changed the label of Yamazaki 12yo. The new label had a dull green line frame and from the bottom of the label erased a Japanese word which means a special-class whisky, leaving only a Japanese word of Whisky (D). In 1990 Sentry Co.

changed its logo or symbol mark (E) (cf. MBC #103). There then became available (F) in May 1996 which has a brown line frame with shadings, not dull green, and it is a current one.

(G) has a different label on which is painted the Yamazaki Distillery. It was issued in 1994 as a souvenir for visitors to the distillery.

In 1996 Sentry Co. launched the Yamazaki Pure Malt 10yo with a deep green label and golden letters

(H).

Yamazaki Pure Malt 18yo first appeared in 1992 and the miniature was available only as a sample(J). It has a black label with golden line frame and letters. The Suntory Whisky Museum opened at the Yamazaki Distillery on March 17, 2000 and there is available the Yamazaki Pure Malt 18yo miniature for visitors only (K).

## TREASURES OF THE PAST

Four more very hard to find whiskies are shown in this article. The first is from the 1940's and the rest are from the 1930's. Every time I see more whiskies from the 1930's, I wish I could have been around at that time to put away a case or two of each. Wouldn't you?

The first mini is **Old Hawk**. The label is very colorful with a hawk in the upper left corner. This clear round bottle is filled with 4yo KSBW. The whiskey was blended and bottled by the Kentucky River Distillery, Nicholasville, Kentucky.

The next two are great examples of the elusive California whiskies. The first is **Old Miner Straight Whiskey**. The tax stamp unfortunately covers a good portion of the miner. This "mild & mellow" whiskey is contained in a

clear flask and was distilled by the Old Quaker Co., Lawrenceburg, Ind. It was bottled for the Thrifty Drug Stores, Los Angeles, Calif.

The "Old 79" has a very colorful label also. The cream colored label has red and black letters with a picture of a "southern gentleman"? in the center. This clear flask is filled with 2 yr. 90 proof Straight Bourbon Whiskey and bottled for S. E. Rykoff & Co., Los Angeles.

The last mini is **Old Armitage**. The clear flask is filled with 1 year old 90 proof straight bourbon whiskey. This was bottled for Dohmen & Allinger Inc, Indianapolis, Ind.

Hope you have enjoyed these super whiskies from Pat McMullen's collection.

# MELO'S MINIS

In this article we'll look at half a dozen pre-pros. Miniatures produced before prohibition is another area which is not well documented. I have no idea how many brands were produced, but I am sure it was well into the hundreds, perhaps even thousands. I do know the number which have survived is in the hundreds and brands are continually appearing that I have never seen before. I only collect bottles with full paper labels and have found some really nice examples considering they are all well over 80 years old.

Anyway, bottle number one has a well known name. It is **Waterfill and Frazier** Kentucky Sour Mash Whiskey. It was bottled by Grommes & Ullrich of Chicago and has a red and black label which states "Must be opened in presence of passenger". This must have been a turn of the century railroad bottle!

Bottle number two is **Carlisle Pure Old Rye Whiskey** from Rochesles Distillery Co. It has a very pretty multi-colored label with bright (real?) gold accents and states 1892 on the label. The glass bottle is a fairly crude Bimal, so





the date is probably accurate.

Next is **Honey Drop Whiskey** from John Spengler of Kansas City, Mo. It has a white label printed in black and gold which features a beehive. It dates from the early 1900's.

Bottle number four is **Old Dominick Fine Old Bourbon Whiskey** from D Canale & Co. Memphis, Tenn. It is BIB 1909-1913 and has a black label printed in gold which did not photograph well. Next is another turn of the century bottle with a black label. It is called **Black Cat Rare & Old Whiskey** from Ullman, Einstein &

Co. of Cleveland.

The last of these is **The Famous Queen of Nelson** by Hilmar Ehrmann & Co. Distillers, Louisville, Ky. The label does not state "Whiskey" which was permissible before the Pure Food Act of 1906.

Finally, did you like the two Reds from California? The Red Robin is one of my personal favorites and should be on anyone's all time list of best looking bottles.

There are now a pair of Zulia Cervezas. One is in brown glass while the other is in green glass and both labels are decals. And there is also a pair of Polar Cervezas, but these are Negra and Light. Polar is bottle in both Spain and Venezuela.

Our last two which also have



decal labels are Corona and Regional. Now while we all know that Corona hails from Mexico, just where does Regional come from? Incidentally, note the nice little decal neck label on the Regional.

These bottles are capped obviously by a professional capping machine and they contain water. That's all I can currently tell you. Now what can you tell me? --S.P.S.—

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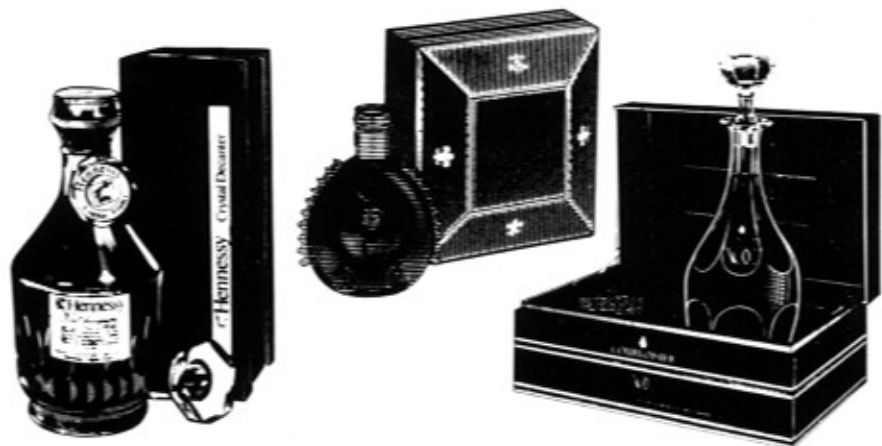
