N.Z. BOTTLED RUM

The cover shows Black Heart and Lemon Hart Rums which together with the 5 rums shown on this page is all the N.Z. bottled rums we know of. (Although there are two versions of each of Ricardo Gold Label, White Mink and Bacardi, probably also Ricardo Black Label, although no one has reported a second one).

Lemon Hart is probably the oldest N.Z. bottled rum and interestingly the label has not been especially printed for a miniature but is off the 4 bottle flask. It states 62/, fl.oz. although clearly the bottle is only about 50ml.

Black Heart is the latest N.Z. miniature and appears to be on sale throught the country.

Ricardo Black and Gold Labels were bottled by C.S. Passmore, Auckland around the mid-1970's and the Bacardi is about the same age having been bottled in Christchurch by the International Bottling Company Limited, perhaps better known for their bottling of Jim Beam miniatures.

The final two, Caribbean Black Oak and White Mink are late 1970's offerings from our good friends Basil A. Fitzpatrick of Rangiora.

Why do I describe Basil A. Fitzpatrick as our good friends? - More of that in a later article.

The Sedgewick Rye Man is in Boozeville today. The distillery sends him around the country giving out samples to everyone who is willing. In Boozeville there are very many who are willing. He hands out small crockery 1/4 pint jugs filled with rye. He'll also pour a shot right from the bottle if you wish. Competition is very keen in the whiskey business. With all the private home-made stills operating in great numbers this forces the bigger distilleries to get out and sell their products.

The Distillery giveaway is probably one of the most sought after bottles in the giveaway class. Not only do the giveaway collectors want it, but so do the whiskey, distillery, and figural bottle collectors.

The one shown here is finished in an overall light blue glaze. It is very thin shelled and I doubt if very many of these have survived since they were made around 1900. He is wearing a large apron with a typical old Dutch cap. The top of his cap is also the cap of the bottle.

He is holding a bottle in one hand and a small glass in the other. And as you can see on the apron is impressed Sedgwick Rye Is My Drink. From the back he seems to be sitting on a tree stump indicating an early style. On the bottom is the crown mark and number 5328. This bottle is 7 1/2 inches tall including the cap. It is a generous giveaway as it holds 3/4 of a pint.



LUXARDO

Girolamo Luxardo of Torreglia, Italy, began issuing their miniatures in 1953 and continued until 1961. Four were reissued in 1968.

There are 3 gondolas, each issued a different year and each with a slight difference in design. They were issued in 1959, 1960 & 1968.




Rated highest of all the Luxardo miniatures is the regal Chess Set consisting of 6 pieces, the King, Queen, Bishop, Castle, Knight and Pawn. A very limited number were sent to U.S. in 1959, mainly in the San Francisco Bay area. Only one sample shipment was sent. It was originally planned to sell two sets in contrasting colours. However, there was difficulty in glazing the figures, they were expensive to make and were soon given up because of the cost involved.





- TEARS OF GOLD -

A true story as related by the Luxardos about the origin of the liqueur LACRIME D'ORO.

THE LARGEST

We all know who has the worlds largest collection of Gins, Vodkas, Cognac, Scotch, Beers or miniatures overall - or do we?

Events have set me thinking. A recent auction in Bath, England was reportedly of 17,000 bottles and was advertised as 'The Worlds Largest Reported Collection of Unduplicated Miniature Bottles'. Our latest member is Pat McMullen of Michigan who, although not claiming the worlds largest collection, was reported in magazine articles in both 1970 and 1980 to have 20,000. David Maund, also a member, claimed a collection of 22,000 in a letter to the writer a few months ago. When I was in Chicago two years ago I met someone who claimed to know of a collection of 25,000 in Japan.

So who does have the largestcollection and who the largest of numerous specialist collections? Serious collectors worldwide probably think Al manuel has the worlds largest collection of both gin and vodka, but does he? (Sorry Al, personnally I don't doubt it for a moment.) Or is it just that he is a very visible collector in these fields? When it comes to Scotch/Bourbon/Whiskey/Whisky or Cognac or Beer there are some obvious prominent choices for worlds largest collection - but would that choice be a correct one?

Does it matter? Probably not, but most collectors would find it interesting to know. Perhaps the other clubs worldwide would like to 'take stock' so to speak and report on what they believe may be the biggest collection either overall or in particular categories. The results could make an interesting article for the MBC.

Just for the record no NZ collection would appear to come even near to being in world class, with the exception of collections of NZ bottles. Erica Mulder has the largest - or does she?
