## **EDITORIAL & COVER BOTTLE**

This edition of miNiZ is late as it was due out in September or early October. Most of you reading this are to blame. I need, repeat need, articles to put a newsletter together. I have now exhausted my supply of articles that I prepared in a fit of madness late last year and must have some contributions from other members if the news letter is to be more than half a dozen pages. I generally get a miNiZ out over the Christmas/New Year period but that seems unlikely this year given the lateness of this, the fact that I have no stock of articles to draw on and that I am extremely busy personally having just bought a new house. Over to you then as to when miNiZ is next published.

The cover bottles are all vodkas from New Zealand's newest public company, 42 Below Ltd. This company only makes premium vodka and most of it is exported. Unfortunately the initial public offering of shares was a good way to lose 40% of your money very quickly!

The minis are a faithful reproduction of the larger bottles except the story of 42 BELOW that features on the back of the larger bottles, is not on the smaller bottles. The bottle is round, glass and 133mm tall. The printing is baked directly on to the glass (no sticker or label attached). The artwork looks virtually the same as the 750ml size bottles and, although they say 50ml, 42% on the bottle, they actually are only 48ml due to bottle production problems in Europe. As you can see there is a plain vodka and two flavoured vodkas, Feijoa and Passionfruit.

My thanks to Erica Mulder for both getting these minis for me and sending me the picture for miNiZ.

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## **BACCARAT CRYSTAL**



Frank Wynn sent the picture of this Baccarat crystal Cognac decanter by A Hardy. It stands about 110mm (4.3") high and is about 80mm (3.15") across at the base. It is nice and heavy and at present is stoppered with a cork, but attached to the neck is the crystal stopper. The cost is \$120 and it is available from Scenic Cellars in Taupo. An excuse for some collectors not to buy it is that it is 100mls, another is the cost!

Scenic Cellars are a must for looking in if you are going through Taupo as they import some very unusual, although expensive, minis.



# NEW NEW ZEALAND



Erica Mulder supplied most of the pictures of new New Zealand bottles this month. I will let the first four sets speak for themselves but, once again, these are private label bottles made by Southern Grain Distillers. They are Hotel de Pecheurs, Duvaucheville, The Grand Hotel, Akaroa, Mayfield Tavern, Ashburton and Papanui Club.



One interesting bit of news regarding NZ bottles is a recent sale of one of the Air New Zealand buildings set (the ones that we had some sets made for us). A Ponsonby Fire Station was sold by Trade Me auctions for \$165 and I have found a number of them in antique shops selling for \$80 or more.





Twelve of the next 13 bottles are for sale by the club. The cost is \$5 each plus postage and Pam has stock available now. She can be contacted on 06 273 4184 (phone and fax), or send your cheque, made out to Port Nicholson Miniature Bottle Club, to Pam Fowler, RD2, Patea, Taranaki.





The one bottle that Pam cannot sell you is the middle one of the last photo, Bond Store Rum. 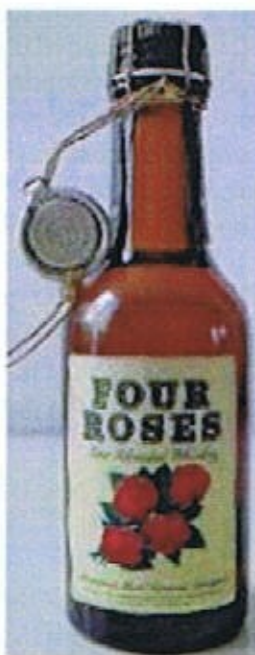

## US WHISKEY ON EBAY



Virgin Bourbon has a black label with white writing and comes in a square clear glass bottle. It was bottled at 6 years old, 107°. It sold for US\$8.01



Four Roses Blended Whiskey will be a very familiar name to all of you. The bottle is round, clear glass and the label is a parchment colour with black writing and red roses. What is unusual is that this is an import into Italy. Note the lead seal. It sold for US\$46.01

Barclay's Private Stock Straight Rye Whiskey was bottled in Detroit Michigan. A very plain label with only "Private Stock" in red. It measures 105mm (a little over 4") tall and is a clear glass flask. The top is metal with a pull top. It has a Florida 1-1/2 cent tax stamp. It sold for US\$6.50

Old Drum Blended Whiskey measures 108mm (4.25") tall and comes in an embossed clear glass bottle with a brown plastic twist top. The embossing consists of an eagle around the front and back labels. The front label is mainly red with white writing. The back label says it is a Tradition of Maryland and was made by Calvert Distilling. The blends are 2.5 and 4 years old. It sold for a cheap US\$4.95.



Golden Wedding Bourbon is well known to US collectors but not very familiar here. It measures about 108mm (4.25") tall and is nicely embossed brown glass. The top is a metal pull tab and the label is gold with "Golden Wedding Bourbon" in red and the rest



in black. It failed to sell. The flask is the common bottle and the round one, as shown below is much less well known. I believe the seller would have been disappointed at only getting US\$4 for it. This is a round brown bottle with a cork seal. The label is in tones of gold, maroon and a bit of blue.

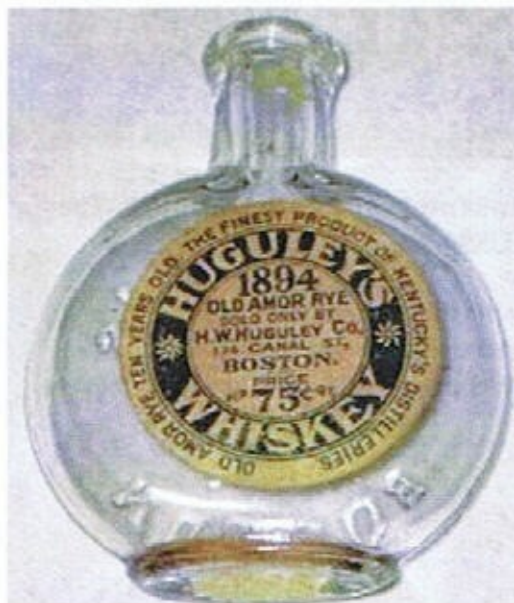


In the last miNiZ we featured a green writing version of Cobbs Creek Blended Whisky. This one is the more common red writing version. Note a few subtle differences, other than the writing colour. One thing that I hate is the tax stamp stuck on the label. It failed to sell.

Next up is Cascade from George Dickel. This is a clear glass bottle with a rip cap top. The label is a dark parchment colour with black and brown writing and a pot still picture. It sold for US\$8

McCormick Straight Bourbon Whiskey is also in a clear round bottle, this time with a screw on metal cap. The label is black and white with a brown seal. It sold for US\$12

The Daniel Webster bottle is certainly a nice one. The bottle is sort of flask shaped and dimpled all over. It was bottled by Paramount Distilling Corporation, Chicago, Illinois. It is 1/10 pint and 90 proof. The label has a parchment background with black and white writing and red panels top and bottom. There is a red screw cap. It sold for US\$31.50



Finally, a truly great bottle. The Huguley's is 3.25" high by 2.25" wide and .75" thick. This is a early corked bottle with an applied lip. It has a paper label on the front saying Huguley's Whiskey 1894 Old Amor Rye sold only by H.H.Huguley Co. 134 Canal St., Boston price per 75¢ qt. Around the edges it says Old Amor Rye ten years old. The finest product of Kentucky's distilleries. On the back the bottle is embossed Huguley's 134 Canal St. Boston. It sold for US\$120.50

# BRANDY IMPORTS



The Brandies on this page are all imported. Some of these have been imported already in bottle and some were bottled here.

The J. Benais & Co. Cognacs were imported by The Simons Proprietry Ltd, Whangarei. Shown are the Extra, Vieille Reserve, 3 ★ and VSOP. All are 4cl.5 (45ml), 43°GL. Not shown (because I don't have them) are a variation of the 3 ★ and a 9cl bottle.

Decaumont seems to have only been imported in a 3 ★ version, with two variations. The importers were J. Anthony Rayner of Auckland and Hardwicke and Robinson of Wellington. The words Lion and Brandy are in red on the Auckland version and gold on the Wellington one.

J. Bertrand & Co. made the next two bottles, a VSOP Cognac and a 3 ★ French Brandy. There has also been at least one more Cognac, a 3 ★ These were imported by Milne Bremner Ltd of Dunedin.

J. Robert & Fils 3 ★ French Brandy was imported and bottled by Quill Morris of Christchurch.

The two Royal Viking 5 ★ Pure Grape Brandy bottles were bottled in Auckland by C. S. Passmore Ltd. Note the slightly tapering bottles, which we will see again later.



Gustav Pierre 5★ Select French Brandy – probably isn't! It is far more likely to be the cheapest available, but then we were not very sophisticated in our drinking tastes in NZ in the 1960's. It does not say so but it was probably also bottled by Quill Morris.



The two Jules Clairon & Co. VSOP French Brandies were bottled by Basil A. Fitzpatrick of Rangiora in the early 1970's. The one on the left has all the writing in red and the one on the right has the eagle and much of the writing in black. Both are on a gold background.

Finally, we get to this page. The Three Larsen 3★ Cognacs were bottled in Auckland by C. S. Passmore Ltd and again these three and the next bottle are tapered. All date from the 1970's and all the labels are identical apart from the

positioning of the bottler's name. The final bottle in the photograph is a Golden Bell 3★ Brandy. This was bottled by Hutchinsons (Wholesale) Ltd of Auckland.

The next photo has two much more modern imports first. These were imported in the 1990's and are both The Douro Fathers 10 year old Brandy from Portugal. Both are a rather weak 37.5%. One was imported by Quill Morris and the Other by Allied Liquor Merchants (who took-over Quill Morris).

The final bottle in the group is J. D. Harcourt 3★ French Brandy. This is as old as the first brandies we saw (probably 1930's) and in immaculate condition.

The final picture shows two ho/hum bottles and one cracker. The Hennessy VS Cognac is 40%, 50ml and can still be found in the bottle stores. Skipping the best, the last bottle is another Gustav Pierre 5★ Select French Brandy. This one is from the 1980's.



Finally we have the tall one in the middle. This is a Grand Hotel 3★ Cognac 'Pure Grape Brandy'. I would guess that this dates from the first 20 years of the last century. It was bottled by Arthur A. Paape.

Sadly almost all the companies that imported or bottled these are long gone.

## AS SEEN ON EBAY #7

The first time that the jug on the right went up for sale it failed to get a bid as the minimum bid was set too high. Erica Mulder eventually bought it for US\$9.50. It was made by Audees of England to commemorate the wedding on July 29th 1981 of Prince Charles and Lady Diana Spencer.



On the left we have a whisky pair from Suntory, Smokey & Co. These were distributed as samples in early 1990's, and are very rare. Each is 40% / 50ml. The one on the left is Fine Mint flavoured and the other Natural Mellow. The pair sold for US\$21.50

The lady measures about 130mm (slightly over 5 inches) tall. She contains Bachum

Cordial from Hans Moser. It is at least 25 years old and probably considerably older. It failed to sell for a measly minimum bid of US\$5.99



On the left is a superb micro – or is it? It is 7cm (2.75") high and appears to be a Bass Pale Ale bottle. However the label states "Bass & Co. Pale Ale Choice Perfumes Bottled by the Rosmapine Co. London from Fresh gathered Flowers." The bottle is black purple glass and dates from around 1900. I have a few of these perfume/beer (& whisky) bottles among my micros and was going to bid on this one. I bookmarked it with 9 days to go and then completely forgot about it. It sold for a minimum bid of US\$9.99



Another bottle that isn't a bottle is the 50mm (2") wooden Cointreau dice holder. I have been lucky enough to acquire a couple of these dice bottles, although they are as rare as hen's teeth. This is reflected in the price they sell for. There has been





one I would like in an antique shop in Bulls for at least three years. They originally wanted \$110 but have dropped the price to \$95 which may be a fair price but it is still more than I am willing to pay. This bottle had a minimum bid price of US\$55 (about \$91) and failed to get a bid.

The king of Hearts is by Garnier who have made a full set of face card bottles. It is 114mm (4.5") tall and contains Crème de Menthe. Bidding was spirited and it eventually sold for US\$18.25



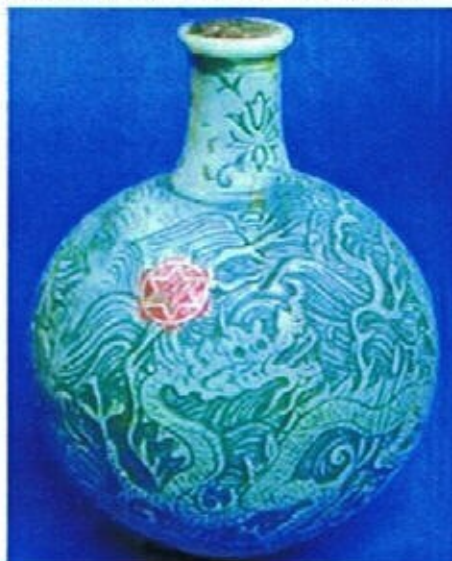
The Bell's Bell will, I am sure, be familiar to you all. You almost cannot give them away in NZ so it always surprises me how much they sell for on Ebay. This one had 8 bids on it and went for £11.10 – about \$30

Some Drioli bottles are common, and some much less so. The one on the left is one of the latter so it was a surprise to me that it sold for a measly £0.99. It is a white ceramic jug with brown highlights, a black handle and a scene depicting a house, mountain and tree on the

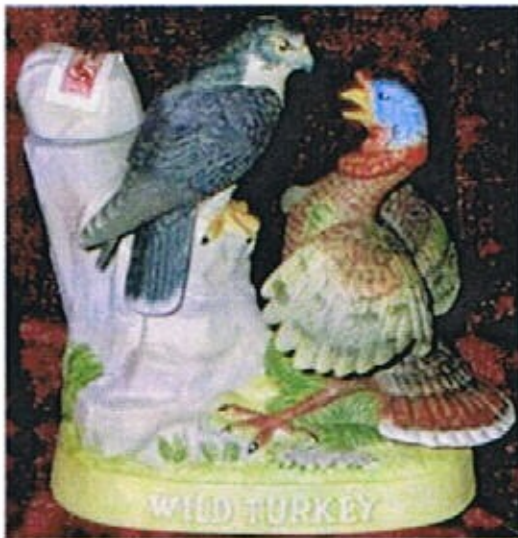


Now for two rarely seen items, both from Isiah of Japan, both of which contained wine and both of which failed to sell. Shame really as they are both nice bottles.

The dragon is a green/bronze colour and is holding a drinking vessel. The vase is a bright green ball shape with an embossed dragon motif.







Starting off this page we have the bisque Wild Turkey minis. These always fetch good money. I have two to show you today, the Turkey & Falcon and the Turkey and Skunks. I feel sure that you will know which is which. Both contain 50ml of Wild Turkey 101 proof bourbon. The Falcon bottle sold for US\$59.95 and the Skunks for US\$49.99

Next we have the Ski Country Circus Elephant. Jumbo is standing on a bright green drum. The mini is 127mm (5") tall and was made in 1994. Bidding was spirited and it eventually sold for US\$19.18

The three horsemen are (left to right) Robert E. Lee, Theodore "Teddy" Roosevelt and Lafayette. They were all made by

Grenadier. They are bisque finish minis and, having had all three myself for many years, I can assure you that the quality is superb. If these had been Ski Country minis they would undoubtedly fetch much higher prices. As it is Robbie went for US\$9.99, Teddy for US\$10.50 and Laffy for US\$9.99



This pair of Scotch jugs is from Rutherford. If it is not obvious, one has a black top and the other purple. Both have the same partridge motif. They





sold for US\$11.62 for the pair.



The sewing machine is from Famous Firsts, an American company, although the container was made in Italy. It is 120mm (4.75") high and was made in 1973. It sold for US\$18.55



The dice is another Italian bottle, this time filled by an Italian producer. This one has white spots on a black background. It is missing the label but as I have two of these, one with red spots and one with yellow, I can tell you that it was made by Tosco. It is a small ceramic at only 57mm (2.25") tall and I would guess was made in the 1970's. It sold for a minimum bid of US\$7.99

The Clydesdale horse is another 1973 bottle and is from Canadian

company Potters. It sold for US\$15.50

The Janneau eagle is 140mm (5.5") high and contains Grande Fine Armagnac. This bottle comes in two versions, one where the china is labeled Limoges and one where it isn't. Unfortunately I have the other one. This is the Limoge version and, being Limoge, sold for US\$104.99



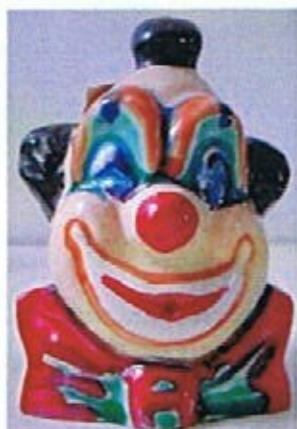
The Coal Miner is number 5 in a series from Old Commonwealth. I thought that this bottle would sell well but it actually sold for a minimum bid of US\$14.99. It is 114mm (4.5") tall, was made in 1984 and contains bourbon.

# BRING ON THE CLOWNS



We start with a series from Suvenir of Argentina. Each of these is about 100mm (4") tall and, as you would expect with clowns, very colourful. The first clown contains Cognac and all the others Argentinian Whiskey.

The first clown was for sale on Ebay and went for US\$24.99.

Not a clown but in the same series as the Suvenir Clowns is Pinocchio. It also sold on Ebay for a cheap US\$6. There is also an Uncle Sam mini in the series but I will be PC and not include this with the clowns!



The next clowns are all from my own collection. The club has on a couple of occasions ordered ceramics and micros direct from Suvenir, the Argentine manufacturer, and this is how I got all these clown heads.



The set of six clowns on this and the next page was made by the Goebel pottery; which probably makes them more valuable as ornaments than as miniatures. They were sent to me many years ago by UK based member



David Maund. They are one of my favourite sets and almost always commented on by people viewing my collection. They contain Scotch.



The final photo from my own collection, at left, again shows a clown from Suvenir. This is the only standing clown that they have made, although there may be some painted differently.

On the right we have a bust of a clown from Ski Country. As with all Ski Country minis this contains bourbon. It stands 127mm (5") tall and was made in 1994. It fetched a surprisingly low US\$7.50
